The Offerings and the Sacred Vessels

The Church has some established norms for the composition of the vessels (such as the chalice) and the bread and the wine offerings to be used during Mass. The requirements arise both from the sacredness of the offerings and the need to ensure the validity of

the Mass. A chalice must be made from precious metal, such as gold or silver. Other precious materials can be used so long as the inside cup portion of the chalice is covered with gold. The same regulations hold for the other sacred vessels that contain the Body and Blood of Christ. This is done primarily because of the sacredness that He will be contained therein but also to remind us that we give to God the best gifts we have. Before the Mass, the chalice is set with several items for use in the liturgy. A White piece of linen cloth with a small red crucifix in the middle, called a purificator is placed folded over the chalice.

The priest uses the purificator to wipe the chalice and other sacred vessels, after the distribution of Holy Communion, to ensure that no particles of the Body and Blood of Christ are simply left to go stale or bad in the vessels and to ensure due reverence is given to them. Though the vessels have generally been rinsed with water before the purificator is applied, the purificator does sometimes come in contact with the Eucharist, so it is washed in a special way that ensures no particle of the Body and Blood of Christ ends up in the sewer. The patten is placed on top of the purifictor on the chalice. The patten is a sacred vessel because it contains the host that the priest holds during the consecration. This host is a little bigger than one many received so it can be more easily seen during the elevation. Above the host and patten is placed the pall. The pall is a thin stiff piece of board that functions doubly as structural support to the articles placed above it and as means for keeping things such as dust or insects from getting into the chalice during parts of the Mass when the patten is not over the chalice. The chalice veil goes over the pall covering the whole chalice beneath it. The colour of the veil matches the liturgical season, by adding to the visual beauty of the Mass. The veil contributes to spirit of reverence and worship. Above the veil is the burse, which consists of two thin stiff pieces of board encased with cloth coloured to the liturgical season. The primary purpose of the burse is to contain the corporal. The corporal is a piece of linen cloth with a small red cross on it. During the offertory, the corporal is unfolded and on the altar and all the sacred vessels are placed upon it. the corporal's material and the way that it is folded and cleaned ensures that if any particles of the Body and Blood of Christ fall on it, they will treated with due reverence. However it's main reason is one of intent. Along with the whole church the priest intents only the bread and wine on the corporal to be transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Christ. The divesting of the chalice that takes place during the Offertory when all these items are taken off the chalice symbolizes the stripping of Christ of His garment in preparation for His Crucifixion.

Living Lent

Purpose of Lent today: Lent is a time of prayer and penance, when Christ wants to lead us back to our baptismal promises of dying to sin and of living for God. We prepare ourselves to enter once again into Jesus' Paschal mystery and to renew it in our lives.

Our Lord: Jesus invited us to follow him by carrying our cross with him each day. (Luke 9:23) He indicated that his followers would fast and do penance after he returned to heaven. (Luke 5.33 35) We are to go hungry and thirsty for the sake of justice (Matthew 5.6) and to do our praying, fasting and almsgiving without showing off. (Matthew 6.16, 16 17)

Christians: From the earliest centuries, Jesus' followers have tried to follow these commands. Since it was on a Friday that Jesus freely died to save us from our sins, the faithful made a special effort to do some form of penance on this day: going without food for most of the day, spending extra time in prayer, doing good works, refraining from eating meat. Like St. Paul, they wanted to offer their penances for Christ's body, the Church. (Collossians 1.24)

In today's Church: Over the centuries, these forms of penance have varied, and sometimes have been neglected. Today, we are being invited once more to obey our Saviour: we are to do penance for our sins and those of others, for the people of God, for peace in the world, and for the building up of God's kingdom on earth. So to make Lent an effective time of renewal for the great celebration of Easter, let us commit ourselves to the practices of Lent.

Praying: Jesus and His apostles tell us to pray always, to be constant in prayer. Traditional times for Christians to pray are morning, evening and mealtimes. Personal prayer is a necessary preparation for our sharing in the Church's public worship, the liturgy. In our love, we join Jesus and all God's people in praying for ourselves, for our family and friends, for our leaders, for those who suffer, and for the Church and the world.

Fasting: Fasting means cutting down on the amount and richness of our food and drink. Done as a penance for sin, it helps us to pray better: an empty stomach can lead to more attentive prayer. The money we save on food should be given to others in alms. The law of fasting obliges adults until they are 60 years old.

Abstinence: This form of penance needs to be seen as a near cousin of fasting. We may give up meat especially on Fridays, the day of Christ's saving death on the cross. Our abstinence is another way of sharing in Christ's work of saving the world. We may also substitute other good actions for abstinence from meat. These could include special acts of charity (visiting the sick or aged, helping those in any need, contributing time or money to a work of charity) or other acts of piety.

Giving alms: We give alms to help God's poor and to support the good works of the Church and other positive agencies. Again our help is being given to Christ in His brothers and sisters. Blessed Teresa of Calcutta when asked how much to give *"give until your can feel it"*. We do not give in order to show off or keep up with others; instead we give cheerfully to God, who has given us everything we have.
