# AN ANGEL IS COMING

101 - 1

If you have been over at our cemetery since the expansion, you have noticed at the end of the road is a turn-around. You will notice rods sticking out of the center. It has always been the desire when the cemetery was expanded not only to make this a place to lay our loved ones to rest, but to remind those who visit that our true home is in heaven and that in Christ there is no death. We on earth are members of Christ's body and the society of the Church as were our loved ones, and, as they still are, nothing separates those bound in Christ. There is no veil that completely cuts us off from them. While our loved ones are never far away, in Christ there is still a mystical union connecting all of us. This is why when we pray for them and in prayer speak to them, we can still, at times, feel them close to us, or indeed they are Christ Himself revealed. As quoted when he said "God the Father is the God or Abraham, Isaac and Jacob" (Mt 22:32), not he was the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. He never speaks of the deceased in the past tense. They are with us. I have been discussing with the cemetery board how to represent this in a way that also honors our blessed dead buried at the cemetery. We have decided on a statue of an angel. You can see a picture of it at the back of the church on the bulletin board.

Keeping to custom, there will be space on the sides and back of the statue for those who wish a special remembrance of family members. The front of the statue will contain words of universal remembrance. The donation for this is \$200.00. It will be shown on your tax receipt next January. Due to space limitations, and, so as to offer this option to as many people as possible, we are asking that only one name be given per donation, (a maximum of 18 characters including spaces). # **Pre-Authorized Giving**

My Mom once said "money can't buy you the things that are most important, but boy do you still need it".

I know, like most people, no one likes to be asked to give more, but I am not asking that at all. I just want, for the sake of transparency, to let you know how our finances are working. As you know, we are not a rich parish, but we have had enough to meet our needs. As the cost of goods and services has risen, you have also increased your donations as well. This allows us to look after all of the bills and also salaries and the many repairs that come up.

However if you looked around at Mass this Sunday you noticed that in the summer months people take the opportunity to go on vacation and enjoy the weather. All good things. I myself will be taking advantage of this in August. But without intending it, what that does is create a boom and bust cycle in our finances. We do well from October to June and struggle July through September.

We do have other funds, but is it right to take money that you give to the Building Fund. I think it would be dishonest to take money entrusted for something else.

However, I might ask that you think about Pre-Authorized Giving. You can sign up for this in the Parish Office. This is a system where money is automatically taken from your account and transferred to the Parish. You obviously set your own amount and it appears on your statement. It is taken only for the regular offerings (no money is removed for second collections). Even when you go on vacation, your donation is made and it allows for an even cash flow for the year. Some people say "well when I am at Mass and it's time for the collection, I feel compelled to put something in". Many people do. Those on Pre-Authorized Giving still get envelopes and simply put a blank one in, writing on the envelope PAG.

# The Good Samaritan

The lawyer asks the lawyerly question, "Who is my neighbor? To whom do I have a responsibility?" And of course, the implication of that question is, "Who is not my neighbor? Who am I excused from caring about? Who can I avoid?" Then the Lord tells this story.

A man is mugged in the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. They say that even today that is a dangerous road and it is very foolish for a traveler to journey on it alone. A priest and lawyer pass by and do nothing. Then a Samaritan comes by and he helps out. Our neighbor is the person in need who crosses out path.

We try to avoid the powerful challenge of that simple truth. "Honor your father and mother?" Of course, but not my father, not my mother, they are old and bothersome. "Respect Church authority?" Of course. We need authority today. But not this bishop, not this Pope, not this priest. "Care about your neighbor?" Sure. But not my neighbors. "Forgive your enemies?" Right! But not the people who hurt me.

In other words, when the challenge of the Gospel becomes concrete, specific, local and personal, we are tempted to become subtle as tax attorneys to find ways of avoiding it. The lawyer and the priest in the parable were not vicious. They probably felt sorry for the man. They would have agreed that we should help our neighbor. But not this one. Not now. What about the next one?

It is so easy for us to avoid the call of the Gospel when it becomes specific and local. The man on the side of the road reminds us that the will of God, the way to holiness, the imitation of Christ, discipleship, being a practicing Catholic is found here and now in this husband, this wife, this family, this neighborhood, this parish, this job, this project, these people, these friends, and these strangers.
