Kerala is India's most densely populated state. It has been ravaged by the worst flood and landslides ever experienced. Over 54,000 Hectares of farmland has been submerged, 75,000 houses damaged, one of the state's three international airports at Kochi was inundated, 82,000 kilometers of local roads and 221 bridges collapsed. 300000 farmers were affected and 44 schools of 18 Diocese, all damaged. REFLECTION

Jesus frequently used the image of a harvest to convey the coming of God's reign on earth. The harvest is the fruition of much labor and growth-beginning with the sowing of seeds, then growth to maturity, and finally the reaping of fruit for the harvest. In like manner, the word of God is sown in the hearts of receptive men and women who hear his word, accept it with trust and obedience, and share in the abundant fruit of God's word in their life with others. The harvest Jesus had in mind was not only the gathering in of the people of Israel, but all the peoples (and nations) of the world.

Jesus gave his disciples instructions for how they were to carry out their ministry.

They must go and serve as people without guile, full of charity (selfless giving in love) and peace, and simplicity. They must give their full attention to the proclamation of God's kingdom and not be diverted by other lesser things. They must travel light-only take what was essential and leave behind whatever would distract them-in order to concentrate on the task of speaking the word of God. They must do their work, not for what they can get out of it, but for what they can give freely to others, without expecting reward or payment. "Poverty of spirit" frees us from greed and preoccupation with possessions and makes ample room for God's provision. The Lord Jesus wants his disciples to be dependent on him and not on themselves. Jesus ends his instruction with a warning; If people reject God's invitation and refuse his word, then they bring condemnation on themselves. When god gives us his word there comes with it the great responsibility to respond. Indifference will not do. We are either for or against God in how we respond to his word.

Jesus makes clear that the true source of our joy is God, and God alone. Regardless of circumstance, good, bad, success or loss, our victory is in Christ. Jesus assures his disciples that he has all power over evil, including the power of Satan and the evil spirits or fallen angels who conspire against us. We, too, as disciples of Jesus have been given the spiritual authority and power for overcoming the works of darkness and evil (1John 2:13-14)
