#### WORKING UNTIL the LORD'S COMING

There were some Christians in the early Church who believed that the Second Coming was very imminent. They became so preoccupied about the approaching end of the world that they stopped bothering about practicalities, *living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work*. <sup>Luke 21:5-19</sup>

Indeed we do profess in the Creed that Jesus will come in glory and there will be the resurrection of our bodies. These considerations should move us to become detached from earthly goods and to make good use of our time. It is through these activities that we will win a place in Heaven. The Second Vatican Council was very insistent on the value of human work: *This council exhorts Christians, as citizens of two cities, to strive to discharge their earthly duties conscientiously and in response to the Gospel spirit.* Second Vatican Council, Guadium et spes, 43

The dedicated Christian should keep in mind that he or she is a citizen of two cities: holding dual citizenship in the city of man and the city of God. Each Christian should strive to correspond to this great calling. <sup>cf Phil 1:27; 3-6</sup>

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a vividly detailed, but, as history has sadly show at times, accurate account of the fact that at times the world will hate us for our ways, are in the end not their ways. But God has given us a great vocation: to be witnesses to the world of His truth and love, just as the Apostles were so we should be cheerful, sincere and understanding with everyone at work. <sup>cf Phil 2:3-4; 4:4; 2:15; 4:5</sup> We should be good workers and good friends to those we work with. St. Paul exhorted the first Christians of Philippi with regard to this responsibility; *Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.*
