

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER BONIFACE

Today is the solemnity of Christ the King, the end of the Church's liturgical. It was

instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in a way to summarize and remind us of the mystery of salvation. Christ has dominion over all creation because as St. John says in the first chapter of His Gospel, "all things were made through Him and without Him was not anything made" (Jn 1:3). Christ did not have to win us over by force, or a show of power. We are his for He created us. In our experience of Christ both in history and in our own lives we know Him to be a loving king who has compassion and concern for all of His creations. For the natural world and for us as well: for Christ so loved the world that He came to gather us together with Him so that we may live as He always intended. This kingdom which Christ initiated is one of compassion justice and truth wherein all people live as one. One with their Lord and one with each other.
