#### AROUND THE ALTAR OF THE LORD



#### <u>The Entrance Rite - The Greeting,</u> <u>Penitential Rite, Gloria and Collect</u>

The priest begins the Mass with the Sign of the Cross, emphasizing that the liturgical act being performed is done in the name of God who has

revealed Himself as a Trinity of Persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It also reminds us that we gather as the people of the Lord made so by Baptism. Go and baptize all nations in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Christ instructs His apostles in Mathew's gospel before He ascends into heaven.

The priest greets the faithful saying: "The Lord be with you." The Penitential Rite immediately follows the Greeting and recalls the need for purification to participate in the Holy Sacrifice about to be offered. In the Confiteor (I Confess), the faithful confess in the presence of God and His Church that they are sinners and responsible for their own sins. The Confiteor expresses desire for conversion and the need for the faithful to pray for each other and receive the help of the Church Triumphant in heaven in order to achieve conversion. This prayer is very appropriate for the early part of the Mass because it reminds the faithful that we are all sinners and have gathered in response to Christ who came "not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" (Mark 2:17). "Absolution" follows the Confiteor. While the priest uses the formula for a general absolution and prays for God's mercy and forgiveness, the prayer does not bestow Sacramental forgiveness of sins. The Penitential Rite concludes with the Kyrie (keeree a), which is a direct prayer to the Lord for His mercy. It is the only part of the Mass which from ancient times to the present the Roman liturgy has offered in Greek. Now in God's presence on Sundays outside of Advent and Lent and on Feast days, the Gloria is sung. "The Gloria is a very ancient and venerable hymn in which the Church, gathered together in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb" (GIRM 53). The opening words of the prayer recall the words of the angels who appeared to the shepherds to announce the birth of Christ. The reference to Christ as the "Lamb of God" recalls the sacrificial character of the Mass where, in fulfillment of the Old Testament sacrifice of a lamb for forgiveness of sins, Christ offers Himself once and for all making atonement for the sins of all for all time. Indeed this is something to rejoice in and praise God for His mercy to us. We have now come to God to ask His mercy, to give Him Glory and Praise, to be with Him and to receive Christ in Holy Communion. We also come with the needs and prayers found in the silence of our hearts. So the priest says, "Let us pray" and we have time to "Collect" all these prayers and give them to God. Ritually the priest offers all these prayers to God and those of the whole Church in the Collect (Opening Prayer). This concludes the opening rites of the Mass and we see Christ answer these prayers in His Word, Body and Blood.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS from the ARCHBISHOP of TORONTO

#### ON-GOING COMMUNICATION Regarding the H1N1 FLU VIRUS

I wish to provide you with an additional update regarding proactive measure in relation to the H1N1 Flu Virus. In my communication of Sept 1, 2009, I provided a number of recommendations based on counsel from health officials and those with pandemic planning.

We have been closely monitoring the situation. At this time it is necessary for us to elevate our diligence to the next level in pandemic planning. For the health and safety of all people of faith, parishes must implement the changes outlined below at all masses as of Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 09 until further notice.

- Temporarily suspend communion from the chalice
- Temporarily suspend communion on the tongue
  - Parishes should provide hand cleaning stations near church entrances
- Refrain from shaking hands during the sign of peace. A nod, bow or other appropriate gesture should be encouraged
- All those distributing communion are asked to wash their hands before mass.
   An alcohol-based sanitizer should be provided so that all ministers may sanitize their hands before and after distributing communion
- Please remind your parishioners that if they are feeling sick or ill, it is best for them to stay home.


