

## ENTERING THE CHURCH -

WHAT DO WE SEE???

There are several important liturgical objects that draw one's attention when entering a Church and each has its own significance. The first is the Holy Water font into which the faithful each dip their fingers and make

the Sign of the Cross. Making the Sign of the Cross with holy water before Mass is a reminder of the Sacrament of Baptism. In Baptism, through water and the invocation of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit one becomes members of the Church. Only once a person has been baptized Catholic can they participate in the Sacrifice of the Mass and receive Holy Communion as one truly in communication with Christ and the Church. So it is particularly appropriate to recall and renew one's Baptism before Mass. The next act one should perform on entering the church is genuflecting towards the tabernacle where Christ, present in the Holy Eucharist is reserved. The genuflection towards Christ in the Eucharist expresses worship and obedience to Christ our God and King of kings. The traditional practice of placing the tabernacle centrally in the sanctuary reflects the arrangements of royal courts where the king sits in the central place and his subjects approach him and pay him homage. The genuflection towards the tabernacle emphasizes the truth that Christ is our ultimate ruler to whom we owe complete service. Furthermore, it reminds us that the liturgical act that we are about to perform, the Sacrifice of the Mass, takes place before the throne of God, the Father Himself, in whose service God the Son came to perform His work of Redemption. A lit red candle near the tabernacle called the Sanctuary Lamp indicates that it does in fact contain the Eucharist. If the candle is not lit and the door of the tabernacle is open, then the tabernacle is empty and one should not genuflect towards it. The holy water and the tabernacle are signs that remind the faithful that when they enter they do so as members of the Church come to worship their God and King.
