GOSPEL REFLECTION

"If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them..."

As the Father anointed Jesus with the Spirit and power (Acts 10:38), Jesus pours out that Spirit on the Apostles, sending them into the world "as the Father has sent Me." Jesus "breathes" the Spirit of His divine life into the Apostles—as God blew the "breath of life" into Adam (Genesis 2:7), as Elijah's prayer returned "the life breath" to the dead child (1 Kings 17:21-23), and as the Spirit breathed new life into the slain in the valley of bones (Ezekiel 37:9-10). His creative breath unites the Apostles—His Church—to His body and empowers them to breathe His life into a dying world, to make it a new creation. He explains this gift of the Spirit in terms of the power to forgive – and correspondingly to retain – sin.

We might ask why he specifies the gift of the Spirit in this way. It is about reconciliation: the reconciliation of the human race to the Father, which is the essential work of Jesus. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus' words to his disciples highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness and reconciliation are gifts to us from Jesus. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share these with others.

Thomas is one of the most clearly defined characters in the Fourth Gospel. He is the realist, the pessimist, who has missed out on the Easter night appearance of Jesus. He won't believe in the resurrection simply on the other disciples' claim 'we have seen the Lord'. He lays down his explicit, highly 'physical' conditions. With the divine 'courtesy' that seems to be a feature of the risen Lord in all the appearance stories of the gospels, eight days later Jesus is prepared to meet Thomas' conditions exactly. But, at the sight of Jesus, Thomas abandons them. Instead, he the late-comer, the obtuse one, makes the most exalted act of faith contained in the gospel: 'My Lord and my God!'. The confession takes us back to the Prologue: 'No one has ever seen God; it is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known'. At this climactic moment of the gospel it is Thomas, the hesitant, the doubter, who brings out the full identity of Jesus.

We who follow are the blessed ones because from us, a faith greater than that of Thomas and the others will be required: the greater the faith the more scope for the power of God. (Excerpts from: *Scott Hahn Reflections; My Catholic Life; Loyola Press; Fr. Brendan Byrne, SJ.*)
