Ascension of The Lord

First Reading: Acts 1.1-11
Psalm: Ps 47.1-2, 5-6, 7-8
Second Reading: Ephesians 1.17-23
Gospel: Luke 24.46-53

The Sanctuary Lamp burns in May for the intentions of: ---

GOSPEL REFLECTION

"...so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

What St. Luke is basically conveying is the continuity between the ministry of Jesus and that of the disciples who, when empowered with the Spirit at Pentecost, will become eyewitnesses and ministers of the Word. So, the disciples are not dismayed, nor do they lament the departure of Jesus. They have a task to fulfil; they will be equipped for that task; they have Jesus' promise that he will return.

The Ascension is the preliminary feast that directs the Church's attention forward to the event of Christ's return, the Pentecost. On that day, salvation will be complete; for salvation is not simply expiation for sins, but something even greater than that. Expiation is itself a necessary precondition of our adoption as God's children. To live that divine life we must receive the Holy Spirit. To receive the Holy Spirit, we must be purified through Baptism.

The forces hostile to God and to true humanity have by no means yet been fully overcome. The essential blow has been struck in the Paschal victory of Jesus, but his messianic work continues as he breathes his Spirit into the Church that carries on his mission. What the Church (we) must understand – what the Ascension assures her – is that accompanying all her labour and suffering is the victory of her risen Lord, who now stands at the right hand of God interceding on behalf of all (Rom 8:34).

While Christ now reigns with his Father, he still dwells in his Body, the Church. Through the Church, Christ acts in the world. Through the Church he announces the immanence of God's Kingdom. The Church, imperfect as an assembly of sinners, still dares to declare the Kingdom. For the Church is made whole through the work of Christ's Spirit.

In this sense the Ascension is not simply something that happened to Jesus – his departure, physically, from this world. It is the feast that celebrates the hope that his triumph will ultimately be ours as well. (Excerpts from: *Brendan Byrne, SJ; Scott Hahn; word-Sunday.com.*)
