GOSPEL REFLECTION

"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Today as a Church, we conclude our liturgical year and celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. The Gospel we proclaim shows the great mystery of our faith: in the moment of his crucifixion, Jesus is shown to be truly the Chosen One, the Messiah of God, the King of the Jews.

Ironically, in today's Gospel we hear these names on the lips of those who don't believe in Him—Israel's rulers, the soldiers, a criminal dying alongside Him. If He is truly King, God will rescue Him, they taunt.

But He did not come to save Himself, but to save them—and us. The good thief shows us how we are to accept the salvation He offers us. He confesses his sins and acknowledges he deserves to die for them. And he calls on the name of Jesus, seeking His mercy and forgiveness.

Jesus' kingdom is the Church, the new Jerusalem and House of David that we sing of in today's Psalm. By their covenant with David told of in today's First Reading, Israel's tribes are made one "bone and flesh" with their king. By the New Covenant made in His blood, Christ becomes one flesh with the people of His kingdom—the head of His body, the Church.

When it comes to the end of time, the governance of humanity will be established by a King—the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He is the only one Who is capable of governing humanity with justice and love. He is the only one under Whose leadership we will all flourish. He is the only one Who will be able to establish universal peace and harmony.

Reflect, today, upon the glorious end of the world when our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe, will return in splendor and majesty to judge the living and the dead and to establish His permanent and unending Kingdom.
