This Sunday's Gospel is a reminder that Christ is alive among us. It's as true today as it was two thousand years ago, when the apostles were "startled and terrified" by the presence of the risen Lord.

Christ's presence today can be less startling. After all, there's no one here with holes in their hands and feet. But when you sit down in your pew on Sunday, turn to your left. There he is. Turn to your right, and there he is. "Peace be with you," Christ says in the Gospel. Shake hands with your neighbour, say "peace be with you," and there he is, saying it to you, too. Take a moment and marvel at the miracle that we are all here—so different from one another, from every corner of the earth—and that we have been called together, to be in this community with him.

Christ is in the face of our fellow parishioners, and in the faces of those our Christian community serves. In the Gospel, Jesus asks the apostles:

"Have you anything here to eat?" Every week, Christ in our homeless brothers and sisters asks that question to our outreach ministry volunteers. He asks that question to our Vincentians when they visit him at home. He asks that question to our RCIA leaders and in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, where the hunger isn't for food but for truth and the way to a joyful life.

This week is Volunteer Appreciation Week. If you are one of those parishioners who volunteers in this wonderful community, consider: who is Christ to me, in my ministry? To whom are my hands the loving hands of Christ, who came to serve and not to be served? How is Christ using me to reveal himself to those precious people who meet us? How can I reflect his face more brightly?

If you aren't yet involved with one of the parish's ministries—but the thought has been on your heart lately—consider: who could you be the face of Christ for, if you give the gift of yourself to your brothers and sisters? Whose life could change because of that gift?

Amid their fear and disbelief, the Gospel reading tells of the apostles' immense joy at seeing Jesus. To see him in our neighbour, to serve him in our neighbour, here at the parish and beyond—there is no joy like this, when we let his presence startle us. When we remember again why we are here, the one who brought us here, and who he truly is: the Lord, alive and in love with us, whose tender heart beats in this community.

WINDOWS ON THEOLOGY

Spring 2024: World Christianity, presented by Gordon Rixon, SJ

Every Wednesday starting from April 17 to May 22, 11:00 am to 12:45 pm. Cost \$160

The course draws on the distinction between mondalisation (transnational cultural pluralism) and globalisation (global monocultural hegemony) to explore the roles of religion and faith in discovering humanity's higher purpose and addressing systemic injustice. Focused through discussion of regional theologies in Asia and Africa and world-wide indigenous movements, the course engages interreligious dialogue to heighten awareness of encounter and social reconciliation. The discussion of indigeneity addresses the experience of residential schools in Canada.

This course is offered as a hybrid course. Participants who wish to attend in-person will gather in Regis College St. Joseph Chapel. Participants who wish to attend virtually will use the Zoom link provided. The Zoom link can be used for all six classes of "World Christianity." All participants will receive a Zoom conferencing link in the confirmation email and again in the weekly email reminders.


