

# ACCOMPANIED FROM FEAR TO FAITH

Was there a time in your life when you were afraid and hid? As a small child, I ran down the lane beside my house, peeking at scary looking strangers passing by. I didn't know why I was afraid but the feeling was all absorbing. Children do this instinctively but we adults do it too. Sometimes our fear can be physical, emotional or spiritual. It always traps us perhaps only for a moment but often it preys on us for a very long time. For me, it was a few moments until they passed by and I was safe again in my own yard.

On a much larger scale, such was the very emotional time of the Apostles after the Resurrection. They hid behind locked doors in real fear of imminent and imagined personal dangers. Then Jesus showed up unannounced and all those fears quieted. They knew him and knew he loved them. Despite all the horrors of the crucifixion (trauma, pain, humiliation) all was well again. Jesus was with them.

Or did you, like Thomas, miss out? Not get the message? There was joy and excitement in the air of that upper room for sure but was this a scam? Were you afraid to believe them? How could it be real? Jesus had died! And although Jesus had raised Lazarus, who was there to raise Jesus? It all seemed beyond reason. So, Thomas demanded some form of proof.

Our fear can spark and feed doubt. There is much in our current time to fear and we hear it loud and often. Perhaps we even share the latest threat. Maybe there are more doubters than believers in my circle. Can I change that? What holds me back from reaching out to a believer who shares the hope of Jesus? Sometimes we just need a little help in our faith lives. Jesus reached out to

Thomas, helping him to believe. How does Jesus reach out to you so you can say with Thomas," My lord and my God!".
