In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus presents us with a vivid and challenging image of discipleship. We are like branches attached to a vine, which is Jesus himself. The branches that bear fruit will be pruned so that they bear more fruit. The ones that bear no fruit will be thrown into the fire.

Even if we are already bearing fruit, Jesus tells us, our Heavenly Father will ensure that we bear even more. How does he do this? By pruning. By cutting away from us the things that prevent us from living the life that he calls us to: our attachments to this material world, our grave sins and petty vices, our pride and selfishness, our excuses, our fears.

What might be the things in your life that are preventing you from a deeper relationship with God? What parts of you need pruning? Or where might God be at work in your life with his pruning shears right now?

Take courage! Jesus tells us that this is all part of the process. Soon you will be bearing more fruit. And the more willingly you let go of those obstacles to holiness, the easier and less painful the pruning will be.

But that raises another question: Should we be worried about the amount of fruit we are producing? Not at all.

How many times in the Bible does God show us that the way he sees the world is not the way we see it? The person who appears to be doing a lot in our eyes may be doing very little in God's eyes. And the person who seems to accomplish little may in fact be a great saint. The important thing in terms of our own agency and choice is not the fruit we appear to be producing but how deeply we are abiding in Christ.

Jesus tells us very bluntly: "Apart from me you can do nothing." Nothing. Not "a little." Not "only a few things." *Nothing*.

For me, that is the most powerful, the most astounding part of this passage. It blows apart every expectation instilled in us by our culture to be busy and productive, to do and to be seen to be doing. And we bring those expectations into our spiritual life. Surely, it's all the things I do – the prayers and the good works – that make me holy and will get me into heaven.

But Jesus says no. The greatest thing we can do, the *only* thing we can do is to let go – of our pride, our selfishness, our pettiness, our desire for control, or whatever it may be in your life that is preventing you from abandoning yourself completely to Christ working through you.

And here's the kicker: Once you do let go, once you surrender yourself completely, God will take care of the rest, and there will be no limit to what he can accomplish through you.


