THOMAS THE DOUBTER

Poor St. Thomas, because of today's Gospel reading, he has been labelled through the centuries as Thomas the Doubter. I always feel sorry for him and for all who are dismissed or marginalized as unfaithful or disloyal, because they ask questions, or see things in a different way.

Thomas can't seem to shake the name Doubter even though, in reality he was a man of great faith. He was an apostle who, as tradition would have it, traveled outside of the Roman Empire as far as India to preach the Good News and establish the Church in different places and cultures.

The doubt of Thomas was part of his faith. If you know things for certain, you don't need faith. But if you come to know the truth, despite the questions and uncertainty, without the rational or empirical knowledge, then that is faith. Like Thomas, we have faith in Jesus Christ who died







and rose from the dead, even though we have not seen him in the flesh or heard his voice as his disciples did.

How do we come to know and believe that Jesus is risen and is present in our lives? At some point it may be through a personal encounter of the Lord. But we also know him through the community of believers which proclaims over and over again that Christ has died, that he has risen. They have come to know him in their life together as the Body of Christ (the Church), through Scripture and teachings of the Church, and in the breaking of bread, his Body and Blood, in the Eucharist.

St. Thomas is able to personally encounter the risen Lord when he is with the frightened community of believers still hiding away in a room somewhere in Jerusalem a week after the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is the growing and deepening faith of that community that gives Thomas the freedom and courage to ask his questions and the eyes and ears to witness the truth of Jesus standing among them.

Let us pray that the Church and our parish community, be welcoming to all who seek the truth, believers, doubters and questioners alike, so we may all come to know the risen Lord in our midst and become, and like St. Thomas, faithful witnesses to the Good News that Jesus Christ is risen... Alleluia, Alleluia.


