ATTENTIVE JOY

This week Advent is illuminated by joy, as we hear the call to rejoice throughout the scriptures. The pink candle on the wreath brings that hint of light to us and promises us that "the coming of the Lord is near."

One of the names of Christ in this season is Emmanuel -"God with us." This name brings me tremendous consolation, for it means I never face anything alone. Do we experience and believe that God is with us?

I know how easy it is to forget the closeness of God in the midst of daily life. We get busy, we are hurrying to complete our to-do lists, we are attending to everyone around us, and we miss God's presence and wonderful work. Maybe that's just me! But when I slow down and take a closer look, when I really listen, I begin to see God's power at work all around me. In the beauty of creation, in volunteers sharing their gifts, in the children playing in the snow, in meals shared with friends, and perhaps most especially in the voice of those who come to our parish seeking help, guidance, and prayer on their darkest days.

In today's Gospel Jesus calls us to be attentive to good news about the liberating, healing, reconciling, energizing, and transformative work of God in our world right now, and to share what we see. Can we be witnesses to the ways God has touched our lives and is transforming the world around us? As a community of faith, can we be the hands and feet of Christ, showing up with compassion to care for those most in need of God's presence?

These prayerful moments help us to express our longing for God's presence, so that we might be ready to encounter Emmanuel, God with us, and tell of the good news of his presence in our midst.

May all who long for Christ be attentive to his presence, that our joy may shine out. For, as Jesuit Pierre Teilhard de Chardin wrote, "Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God."
