

### UPLIFTED WITH HOPE

Advent is a season of hope. Imagine that one is suffering from some serious affliction that causes sorrow of a holistic nature: physical, psychological and spiritual. The prophet Baruch tells us that God calls us to take off that garment and put on a new robe of splendour. Can we imagine it?

We are bid to arise, to stand tall and look towards the light, the eastern sunrise, and to see our legacy, perhaps see our children or our good works ransomed from captivity —brought to fulfilment beyond our dreams. We hear that God is steadfast in His promises to redeem all suffering. Not only that, God has ordered that the ground be made level for us so that we may

face the journey forward in safety and the cool shade.

Our Psalm grounds us by recalling the restoration God has already brought about, and looks forward to the promise of future restoration after the current suffering. Noticing and experiencing God's work fills us with joy! Paul's joy comes from the faith of the Philippian community. His prayer for them (and for us!) resides in his hope that through God's grace, what began in faith will flourish as our love grows to overflowing. And then there is John the Baptist, who declares that NOW is the prophesied time - when the way will be smooth, and the afflicted will make the journey safely. Do we see God's restorative work now, in our time, even or especially in moments of difficulty? Are we uplifted in the midst of our own suffering?

Today as we witness or experience the challenges of illness and aging, we are called to be people of Hope. We are invited to put off the garment of suffering and to stand tall to see what is still possible; to see what is still "gift"; to live fully in each moment. We should be filled with joy for the great things that have filled our lives to date and with hope for the possibilities ahead. Like the seed sown, the good works we have begun will be harvested. We can experience the transformation of our suffering with the grace that is still present in our days, and we can transcend that suffering to pour out the love that we have received. In my many years as a palliative care physician, I have seen the fruits of this kind of hope as I have accompanied those who are dying.

In the upcoming Jubilee Year, we are called to be pilgrims of hope. I invite you to engage with these issues in our upcoming January series: **Horizons of Hope** when we can learn together how it may be possible to address suffering with faith, hope and love.
