FAITH, HOPE, AND THE NEXT GENERATION

The Gospel reading this week gives us two great examples of living in faith and hope. The Holy Family act as exemplars of the faith and hope parents should have for their children. Mary and Joseph followed God's will and trusted in God to see them safely home, and are now presenting Jesus in the Temple according to Mosaic Law. They have shown their faith and trust in God, and they have hope that their child will grow up to be the Messiah, "the Consolation of Israel." As parents we hope that our children will continue to make the world a better place and that our own faith in and trust in God will help us guide the next generation to be moral actors in the world.

Since 1856, St. Basil's Parish has been home to people of all ages and needs. We are blessed because you are all here!

Mothers are welcome to nurse their children in church or provide them snacks as needed. If you need to, feel free to walk with your child in the back of the church or in the hallway off the side aisle.







Simeon exemplifies the faith and hope that we must have as Christians for the next generation as a whole. Simeon "a devout and righteous man" shows faith by his devotion to Mosaic Law, and hope that he shall see the Messiah of the Lord before his death. Simeon does not presuppose who the Messiah shall be, or assume how they shall be the "Consolation of Israel." Rather, Simeon recognizes that the Messiah is not his generation, but the next and blesses Jesus and celebrates the great change that Jesus shall bring.

Reflecting on these two examples, we wonder how we are demonstrating our faith and hope. Through our words and actions, do we exemplify our trust in God? Or are we sharing our anxieties and fears? Are we devoted to the next generation of leadership like Simeon? Ready to listen to and celebrate new leadership? Or are we set in our ways, wanting to influence how things will turn out? St. Basil's has become a place for our family to strengthen our trust in God. Our children have been recognized and celebrated for their gifts independent of us. As God's people, we continue to reexamine our faith, hope, and role in welcoming the coming Kingdom.

R.C.I.A. RITE OF WELCOME & ACCEPTANCE

For the last several weeks, a group of inquirers (people interested in the Catholic Church) have been meeting with the R.C.I.A. team here in our parish. During this time, they have explored their own faith journeys; they have prayed and decided to take the next step into the Catholic faith. This step involves a liturgical rite: the Rite of Acceptance (for the unbaptized) and the Rite of Welcome (for the baptized). They will "assemble publicly for the first time declaring their intention to the Church [...] the Church, in turn, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members." (RCIA Paragraph 41)

We, the parish, as the Church, have a part in this Rite. We are asked to warmly welcome these catechumens and candidates into our faith family and to support them with our prayers.

This Rite will take place this weekend at the Sunday 10:30am Mass. We ask you to prayerfully and joyously participate in this Rite. Please take the time after Mass to meet and greet these people after Mass or at coffee hour.

They are embarking on a wonderful adventure and you are a part of it. Please do keep all of the catechumens, candidates, parish sponsors, and R.C.I.A. team in your prayers.
