

EXPERIENCING AND LIVING MERCY

"Be Merciful, just as your father is merciful." When I read this line in this Sunday's Gospel, I immediately thought of the parallel line in Matthew's Gospel: "Be perfect, just as your heavenly father is perfect." Jesus is setting a tall order for us, which of us could even dream to be as merciful and perfect as God? In fact, if we claimed such a thing, we might be closing in on blasphemy! Jesus knows that we cannot be perfect in our human frailty, so why does he ask us? Though it is impossible on our own, we are never asked to do anything alone. Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be with us to the end of the age. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can love beyond our natural capacities.

We can love even our enemies. We can do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us, pray for those who abuse us, and do so with the love and mercy of the Father.

The second reading points us to our call as Christians to bear the image of Christ to the world, another task that can often feel more idealistic than realistic. When I feel bogged down by my own frustrations or challenges, I find it hard to be a light to the world and to love others, to move out of the narrow view of my world and to be attentive to the hurts, challenges and needs of others. How can I be merciful like the Father and a light to the nations like Jesus if I can't even get past my own problems? I think the responsorial psalm gives a pretty good little recipe for moving from the narrow view of my world to a "Kingdom" view.

"It is the Lord who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy" (Psalm 103:3-4)

First, we need to come to the Lord to receive His mercy. Let Him forgive all our sins, heal all our hurts, and redeem us from all our shame. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful opportunity to receive God's mercy tangibly. Once we've let God clean our hearts and clear our vision, we can recognize the gifts He has bestowed on us. God has indeed crowned us with his steadfast love and his unconditional mercy. God never asks us to give what He will not provide. If we find it hard to love or forgive others, perhaps we first need to seek the love and forgiveness of our heavenly Father.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Wednesday, March 5, 2025

Please note Mass will be celebrated at the following times on Ash Wednesday: 7:30am. 12:10pm, 1:30pm, 5:10pm, and 7:00pm.

Ash Wednesday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 60. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
