"I like you very much. Just as you are." Do you remember Mark Darcy (played by Colin Firth) declaring this to Bridget Jones over 20 years ago, in the film based on the book inspired by Pride and Prejudice? Mid-way through the movie, our insecure protagonist is stunned by the idea that she could be loved just as she was.

How often are we similarly surprised by the idea of our belovedness? Some days our unworthiness feels louder than the voice of God's love. We can get too focused on our inadequacies, imperfections, and sinfulness. We say "if only I was a better, more faithful, more trusting, less sinful person, then I would be worthy of God, or have a part to play in God's plan." Surely, we think, someone better must be available to answer God's call.

Since 1856, St. Basil's Parish has been home to people of all ages and needs. We are blessed because you are all here!

Mothers are welcome to nurse their children in church or provide them snacks as needed. If you need to, feel free to walk with your child in the back of the church or in the hallway off the side aisle.







We can consider ourselves in good company then, with Isaiah, Paul, and Peter, whom we meet in our scriptures today. Each of them has an awe-inspiring encounter with God's presence, and responds first with fear and a focus on their limitations. Yet, none of them remain stuck in their sense of inadequacy. For God's love is relentless, and God's grace is always being poured out to heal, encourage, strengthen, and send us out. Peter, Paul, and Isaiah allow their encounter with God to form and transform their lives. Perhaps their "yes" came from trusting that it is no longer up to them to strive alone, but that God will be their constant companion and partner in the mission to which God is calling them. Can we have the same trust and hope in God's grace, which has been and is being poured out for us?

During each Mass we are reminded that God desires to draw near to us in our imperfections. First as we gather, we ask for forgiveness and then sing God's glory ("Lord have mercy...Glory to God..."), and right before we come forward to receive Christ's presence, we again declare our imperfection and our trust in God's grace ("Lord I am not worthy...but only say the word..."). This pattern of the Mass reminds us that our faith is not focused on how bad and inadequate we are, but on the generous, gratuitous, abundant love of God. God wants to come and dwell with us. The first step is our willingness to move past our fear and failings, and simply receive God's love.

Like Peter in today's Gospel, Jesus is coming to encounter us in the midst of our daily lives, and might ask us to try again, or to let something go, or to come and follow in a new way. Will we have the courage and trust to say yes, first to encounter God just as we are, to allow grace to enter and transform our lives, and then to participate in God's mission of love in our world?
