A few years ago, I was dealing with chronic pain in my shoulder and elbow, and went to see a physical therapist. To my surprise, we ended up working on building up other parts of my body in order to address the pain. This taught me profound lessons about the interconnectedness of my own body, and brought me a new sense of understanding and awe to St. Paul's description of us as the Body of Christ.

By our baptism, we are interconnected through Christ across every barrier and boundary that might divide us. Connected to the person in the pew next to us, the Christians down the street, and the baptized that we have

never seen in every part of the world. We belong to each other, and our lives are wrapped up together.

Prayerfully considering this reality moves me with compassion and curiosity – to wonder about my neighbour, to commit to work for justice, to make choices that uphold the dignity of the most marginalized, and to desire for all of creation to be bound up together in this interdependent web.

proclaimed the truth of Jesus our interconnectedness when we began his public ministry with a mission statement straight from the prophet Isaiah. The reign of God which Jesus announces and embodies is good news for the poor, vulnerable, and oppressed - and therefore good news for us all. The document opening the Jubilee Year reminds us that "Jesus [presents] himself as the fulfilment of the "year of the Lord's favour"" (Spes Non Confundit, §10). During this Jubilee Year, let us seek to grow closer to Jesus, who will teach and empower us to embody hope, liberation, and restoration, and so continue as partners in Christ's mission.

This weekend we conclude the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God. As Christians, let us continue to pray and work for the Church to be a place of true dialogue, encounter, and communion across our differences. One way to grow closer to Jesus and build connection in the Body of Christ is through encountering the Word and one another. Our Tuesday evening online gathering, Breaking Open the Word, is one place where our parishioners seek to engage the scriptures and walk together as Christians.
