

HOPE IN AND THROUGH CHRIST

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth."

As a college student I participated in World Youth Day, and these words were the central theme. It was a profound time of encounter for me: with Christ and with faithful Catholics from around the world who gathered together in our diversity as the Body of Christ. I experienced prayer, hospitality, and profound friendship that increased my sense of faith, hope, love, and joy.

While I had been Catholic my whole life, this experience of prayer and community brought me

close to Jesus and set me on a path that would lead to my discerning a vocation to serve the Church as a minister. Our readings today remind me of this part of my faith story, and of the call to proclaim Christ to all nations.

We might sometimes think that proclaiming Christ is an intellectual activity which requires us to know a lot about God and have all the right answers memorized. It's certainly true that we should commit to learning and studying our faith. However, more importantly, this proclamation is about being rooted and grounded in a relationship with a person: Jesus – who loves us and comes to dwell with us, who frees us from sin and the power of death through his life, death, and resurrection, and who reconciles us to God. So, the starting point of any proclamation ultimately is: Do we know Christ? Have we been transformed by our encounter with him? The proclamation then is simply this: sharing with others the love and transformation of life that comes from our deepest and most profound friendship.

As we end the Easter season, we might consider taking some time to reflect on our relationship with Jesus, and our own faith story: who or what has helped us to encounter Christ? It might not be easy to see our own faith story, but we can ask the Holy Spirit to guide our reflection and deepen our relationship with Jesus.

The Catechism tells us that "Christ's ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain" and "signifies his participation, in his humanity, in God's power and authority." (§665, 668). What this means is our human-ness is no longer cut off from God, but is essential to God's saving work. We are promised that "we too shall go where he, our Head and our Source, has preceded us". (§661) Thanks to the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, nothing will ever separate us from the love of God. This is the Good News and our hope. We do not need to escape our humanness to be united with God. Instead, Jesus will show us the way to the Father. He is never far away, but always drawing us closer in friendship. Let us open our hearts and ask the Spirit to help us respond.


