

FOOD OF THE KINGDOM

"Take – Bless – Break – Give" Did you hear these words today? They are a sign of Eucharistic celebration. We hear them in Paul's account of the Last Supper, and in Jesus' feeding of the multitudes. This pattern is echoed in Jesus' resurrection appearances, where the disciples know him in the breaking of the bread. Every time we gather for the Mass, we remember that Jesus "took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples." In fact, we embody this pattern through our ritual action: we take up the gifts, bless them, break them, and give them to the faithful.

I am struck by how the crowd in the Gospel would have experienced this feeding moment as good news. Jesus not only proclaims the Kingdom of God, but enfleshes the in-breaking reign of God in the midst of the poor and hungry crowd. As they are fed, satisfied, and leftovers remain, the crowd experiences the promised kingdom of abundance and equality that the prophets promised. The vision of that hoped-for world where all are satisfied without cost comes to life for people who are physically and spiritually hungry.

Have we experienced the good news of God in this way ourselves – as something not only to be heard, but to be encountered with our whole being? Have we been nourished, loved, and transformed by our encounter with Christ? When we share our faith with others, do we enflesh God's love through our words and deeds, so they may encounter this transforming love too?

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we, like the crowd, are caught up in the reign of God that Jesus lived and died for. We too experience our profound equality before God, we are reminded that all is gift, and we receive what we need to truly satisfy us. Encountering Christ's Real

Presence strengthens us with abundant graces to live our faith out in the world, being witnesses to the kingdom of God breaking into our midst. The Eucharist is a Sacrament of Initiation because it continually forms us to live as the Body of Christ in the world.

What does it mean to live Eucharistically? Take-Bless-Break-Give is the pattern of Jesus's life, of the liturgy, and of the life of discipleship. Jesus calls us to receive God's gifts with open hands, to turn our hearts towards God with praise and thanksgiving, to be responsive to the pain and suffering of the world even if it means our hearts breaking, and to become gift given for others, partnering and participating in God's constant self-gift in our world.

Perhaps we feel overwhelmed at the idea of meeting the needs of those who are physically or spiritually hungry. Can we, like the disciples, see the needs of those around us and offer what we have to Jesus, trusting that he can bring the abundance that we need to multiply our gifts? May the Eucharist we share today nourish us always for the work of the kingdom.

- 4. You can listen to the channel directly on your phone, or you can connect your phone to a bluetooth device such as hearing aids or earbuds.


