This Sunday you might notice something special. Rose liturgical vestments instead of the Lenten purple. Prelude and postlude music at Mass, different from the other weeks of Lent when they are muted and we depart in silence. You might also notice the days having more light, especially as we mark daylight savings time. This Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday, is the mid-point of our Lenten journey. We pause in the midst of our Lenten desert experience to look ahead to the promise of God that comes with Easter. The entire liturgy encourages us to be grounded in the truth of God's love as we approach the last weeks of Lent and Holy Week. Our readings speak of God's great reconciling love which brings restoration and light to the world in Christ. It's a good time to take stock of our image of God and ourselves at this mile-marker, to help us to hasten toward Easter.

How many of us feel like we are in exile, flung far from God's grace? How many of us feel







ashamed and afraid of how God looks at us imagining judgement, anger, disappointment or disdain from God? How many of us feel deeply alone and isolated, cut off from community? Our readings today ask us to emerge from the shadows of shame into the light of God's love that calls us into relationship. To remember that God is not an angry and avenging deity, but rather a beloved parent reaching out to us with arms extended in embrace, binding us together into community. Fear might keep us trapped in the shadows, preferring the darkness, but God's light is not a harsh spotlight of accusation, but the warm, guiding, and life-giving light that allows us to grow in faith and be restored to fullness of relationship.

With hearts open to the light we can tell the truth about our lives and experience being drenched by God's mercy. When we remember that faith and conversion is not about how bad we are but how good and loving God is, we can receive grace and be transformed towards right relationship with God, neighbour, and all creation. As we continue our journey of preparation for Easter, consider approaching the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You'll find a guide on our Lent webpage. In this Sacrament we trust we will meet a forgiving and loving God who wants to free us from sin, and always strengthens us through grace to live our faith more fully in our life.

Sometimes the words of a hymn I sang as a child return to me as I walk to work and hear the birds sing, or when I meet people at this parish: "the message is God still loves the world, God still, still loves the world [...] God is passionately busy loving you and me." If only we believed this. If only we lived this. How different would our lives and our world be? Rejoice!
