When I was in university, I went bowling with friends for a charity fundraiser, and received an award – a full-size bowling pin emblazoned with my lackluster achievement: Lowest Individual Score (in the whole bowling alley)! Others may have been ashamed at this very public spotlight on a failing, but I had long learned to laugh at my lack of athletic ability – so I wryly displayed the award in my dormitory for all to see my weakness.

I think that there's some parallel between my "biggest loser" award, and the foolishness of the Cross that St. Paul refers to in the Second Reading. Two millennia after Christ's life, death, and resurrection, we are so used to the symbol that perhaps it has lost its meaning for us. Crucifixion was the brutal capital punishment used to annihilate opposition to the Roman Empire, and instill fear in those living under their oppressive regime. To invite people to faith by proclaiming Christ crucified would certainly be more absurd than my proudly declaring I was the worst bowler. To the world, the suffering







Messiah seems like an utter defeat. Jesus does not meet contemporaneous Jewish expectations of a Messiah: he did not overthrow the brutal colonizing Empire. Instead, Jesus lovingly absorbs, exposes, and disrupts its violence in the Cross. Even in his Resurrection, he is no hero who exacts revenge and vanquishes his enemies, but instead empowers his followers to become courageous witnesses of God's transforming love. For the Greco-Roman context, the Crucified One is a joke, with neither scholarly pedigree nor secret sage wisdom. Jesus defies all our expectations of God and King. Yet, along with St. Paul, we who have been transformed by God's love can still proudly proclaim Christ Crucified and Risen.

Jesus' Life, Death, and Resurrection reveal God's strength. The Good News that Jesus lived and died for was this: God is bringing the world back into right relationship - so that we all may be united in love of God and love of neighbour. Jesus called the last, the least, and the lost into transformation of heart that leads to the Kingdom of God. Jesus embodied a different kind of power through God's merciful way that brings liberation, justice, and peace. Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection reveals God's strength: God is decisively on the side of the oppressed, the abandoned, the despised, and the disposable, and death does not have the last word. God's Reconciling Love cannot be stopped, not even by death. Jesus embracing vulnerability may seem like "weakness" but God's life is stronger than anything that the powers-that-be can use to destroy.

This week, let us allow Jesus and his Cross to confront us anew. Consider: Are there idols or versions of God that we need to drive out of our hearts? How has the Cross of Christ transformed your life? Have we (personally and as a Church) embraced God's "foolish" and "weak" ways of mercy, compassion, vulnerability, forgiveness, inclusion, hospitality, and solidarity? Are we willing to be fools for love when it comes to

living kingdom values in this world, even if it means letting go of the world's definitions of power, prestige, strength, wisdom, stability, and security? How can you more fully respond to the central commandment to wholeheartedly love God and your neighbour?

For Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, we celebrate the Scrutinies with the Elect (preparing for baptism). At these Masses we experience different readings and special prayers. We pray that the Elect may be freed from any obstacles to their embrace of Christ, and for them to be strengthened in faith before their baptism. As we continue in our Lenten journey, let us pray for the Elect, and ask that God will transform us all, that we may embrace the Cross of Christ, so that God's wisdom and strength can be revealed in our lives.
