

Springtime is unfolding in our midst, and we are finally seeing the world transformed from the cold, dark of winter, to this mild and colorful season. All around us, the city bursts with hope: moods are lightened, gardens brightened, and there is a feeling in the air of possibility and newness. It is a time of palpable transformation and change.

Amidst the change in season, we also find a spark of newness and hope in our Lenten season – Laetare Sunday, a day to rejoice as we are prompted to look forward to Easter and the Resurrection.

us to simply witness transformation around us. We ourselves are also to be transformed. In our second reading this week, Paul reminds us, "If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" Christ makes us new at our Baptism, and we continue to be moulded and transformed as we journey through this life, towards union with Him. As the sun warms the earth, melting the snow and bringing forward new life, so does Christ our Eternal Light, melt our hardened hearts and call us to continual conversion and growth.

The Gospel reading this week speaks to the most effective seeds of transformation: mercy and unconditional love. We hear of the prodigal son, who departs from the Father to make his own way in the world, demanding in advance the inheritance that would be owed to him upon his Father's death. He wanders off to foreign lands, only to squander his wealth, and find himself empty, alone, and destitute. Eventually, repenting, he chooses to come back to the Father. What the son expects upon returning is not transformation, or newness. Rather, he expects to stay exactly as he was - a hired hand, alone, belonging to no one except by contract. But the mercy of the Father transforms him in a life-changing way. He is made new as he recognizes his true sonship, based not only in blood, nor contract, but in the unconditional love, and unwavering choice of the Father.

Unconditional love transforms. Love is the seed that can bring forth growth and life from even the most barren places of our hearts and our world. Let us sow love this Lent; let us sow forgiveness, and patience, and selflessness, and let us watch these things grow, spread, and give hope to the world. Let us also be open to receiving the love and mercy God wants to offer us this Lent, so that we might continue to be transformed, and can bloom and shine as the Lord's new creation.


