

WONDER IN THE SHEPHERD'S HAND

I am grateful to serve as a catechist in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) for children aged 3-6 at St. Basil's. The heart of the catechesis is the Parable of the Good Shepherd, part of which we hear today. Jesus announces himself as the Good Shepherd, calling each one by name. The sheep listen to his voice and follow him. In CGS we announce the parable, meditate with the children, show them materials that illustrate the parable, and wonder about the words of Jesus.

Since 1856, St. Basil's Parish has been home to people of all ages and needs. We are blessed because you are all here!

Mothers are welcome to nurse their children in church or provide them snacks as needed. If you need to, feel free to walk with your child in the back of the church or in the hallway off the side aisle.







Encountering the parable with children strengthens my faith, as I reflect on the face of God that is being revealed to them and to me. The children experience wonder and joy in the most essential elements of our faith, especially God's love experienced through Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

When I pray with this parable, I stay close to God and deepen our relationship so that I can listen to his voice. This is a precious time when I can experience a loving intimacy that God longs to give me. It's a gift that continues to guard and guide me. I listen to God's gentle voice speak to my heart whenever I can. How can we hear God's voice in times of upset, disappointment, frustration, failure, loss, pain, or abandonment? In modernity, the voice of God can be shut off from our hearts and replaced with various distractions, leading to confusion and wandering. There have been times when I've struggled to hear God's voice when I've been abandoned, disappointed, overworked, upset, or in pain. In those moments, I've had to work hard to believe that the Good Shepherd will find me, come to me, and that I can hear his voice in this complicated world. When I allow myself to hear the Good Shepherd, I realize that he's been there

all along, waiting for me to hear and follow.

As followers of Christ, we must choose the posture of hearing, listening, and following His voice as sheep follow their Shepherd. When I can hear Christ's voice again, I see more clearly and can better understand the people of God around me and in my life. This enables me to deal with life more effectively. I know when I need help and, even better, I know whom I can help.

By listening and trusting the Good Shepherd, we understand the concept of salvation and the unshakable nature of God's love and care for us (His children of any age). Jesus promises that no one will snatch us out of his hand. This offers us hope, assurance, and unwavering commitment from the Good Shepherd and the unbreakable bond of love. So, let us hear Jesus' voice and, as we build our capacity to listen, let us strive to be like the Good Shepherd—loving, kind, patient, strong, humble, forgiving, compassionate, and merciful. To love as He loves.


