> Jesus invites us all into the mystery of the Trinity, giving the directive to "go make disciples" through baptism and bear witness to God's love in the world. God, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, comprising the most Holy Trinity, are known as a perfect communion and an infinite exchange of life-giving love. The Trinity is a vocational role model par excellence.

> Married couples receive the grace of the Trinity, as the source from which "all true love flows," in a special way on their wedding day (Amoris Laetitia, n. 71). Early Christians grappling with language for the Trinity described it as a "circle dance" or a "dance of love." A relationship of mutuality and an enduring loop of self-giving were ways of understanding the mystery of the Trinity. As vows and a richly symbolic ring are exchanged by the bride and bridegroom in the Trinitarian formula, a new covenant relationship is formed. The wedding band is a symbol of a







couple's participation in an abiding mutual love. Spouses are commissioned as coupled witnesses to the life of the Trinity.

The Trinitarian presence in the wedding liturgy's signs and symbols will be explored by St. Basil's wedding ministry on May 28. Couples preparing for marriage will be welcomed into the sanctuary to learn more about the language and symbolism of the wedding liturgy. By enhancing their familiarity with the rite of marriage, the hope is for couples to be more fully present on their wedding day as they begin to live out the richness of their yows.

Marriage is only one expression of the Trinity's "dance of love," revealed in all vocations. No matter what vocation God calls us to, by living a life of divine purpose we enter more fully into the mystery of the Trinity.


