#### THE LORD IS NEAR

We end the liturgical year today with the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. I find it difficult to reconcile an image of a macho and mighty king (like Thor or King Arthur) with the Jesus of scriptures, who came from a small town, eschewed power and was crucified. However, it is precisely remembering that Jesus is the Crucified King which helps me find a doorway into celebrating this feast. For Jesus is king in ways that defy our understanding of power and might. Through his life, death, and resurrection, Jesus exposes the lies and brutality of the powers-that-be and the empires of our world. The Kingdom of God which he lived and died for is about liberation not domination. and Jesus' leadership is marked by solidarity and

compassion, not might and vengeance. In the Cross, delivers us from the cycle of continually transmitted violence and instead transforms it through God's love and grace.

Sometimes I am disheartened by the "tragic gap" between the Church and world as it is now, and as God dreams it to be. Even as we celebrate Jesus as king, I feel the kingdom is far away. Recently these familiar words which Jesus taught us struck my heart anew: "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven." I imagined God's reign of justice, peace, mercy, and right relationship breaking into and transforming our Church and our world in every place where these words are prayed by people of faith. Imagine with me a world where Christians enfleshed the Truth of God's love as revealed by Jesus. In this kingdom, how would we spend our time, our energy, and our resources? Who would belong? And what practices would we leave behind?

Jesus says "I came into the world to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." What truth do we learn when we listen to Jesus? Perhaps as the liturgical year draws to a close, we can consider ways to consistently make space to listen to Jesus' voice through scripture and silence. As we mark this Feast, may we come to know Jesus and embrace our call as the baptized to proclaim Christ's kingdom through our prayer, action, and partnership with God's work.
