REASONS TO HOPE

Advent is a season of preparation for the coming of Christ, who is the light of the world. The colour purple serves as a visual reminder of the need for reconciliation as a means of preparation for this season. Spiritually, it is a time of interior attentiveness and restoration, which can mirror a pilgrimage and hope. Symbolically, lighting four candles on the wreath represents the four Sundays preceding Christmas Eve. Liturgically, the first Sunday of Advent signposts the beginning of a new church year.

St. Paul urges us, 'now is the time to wake up because salvation is closer now than when we became believers.' This is true: we became believers. God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. (Romans 5:5) So we might ask: when was the time that we first realized that each of us is a beloved child of God, individually known by God and personally loved in the eyes of God?

Notably, this year's Advent season falls during the Jubilee Year, with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" (December 24, 2025, to January 6, 2026). Pope Leo XIV prays that the grace of the Jubilee will make us want to experience divine revelation again. The question, therefore, is how? If we experience chronological time once, how can we re-experience that encounter again?

Fortunately, each Mass revives the cyclical time, calling us to remember and re-experience our faith. The 3-6 year olds in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program can teach us. As they light the four candles on the Advent wreath — hope, peace, joy, and love — the children's cheerfulness and wonder confirm that the purpose is celebration. Some cannot read yet; but they sing reverently, "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20).

It is a mystery that, via sensory experiences and reasoning, children grasp the heart of the Christian message in parables, history, and geography. Gracefully, children connect the Incarnation of Jesus with Emmanuel (Isaiah 7:14), the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6), the Light of the World (John 8:12), the Good Shepherd (John 10:11), and more: Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition are one Dei Verbum (the Word of God).

Hence, in this season of new beginnings, let us encourage one another to participate in 1. being friends with time and remembering our respective faith journeys; 2. re-awakening in us the seed of the Gospel we heard; and 3. pronouncing our faith with our own lives. For hope does not disappoint us (Romans 5:5).
