

The kingdom of God is a topsy-turvy place. In our Gospel, Jesus shockingly declares that discipleship demands renouncing our possessions. In Jesus' time wealth, status, and power were seen as marks of God's favor. Don't we often think this too? Don't we eagerly seek to imitate the popular, wealthy, and successful, while turning away from the poor and marginalized in our midst?

Jesus calls us to imagine a different way forward. Jesus knew that all too often, our attachment to wealth, influence, power, and possessions traps us in collective sin as it separates us from authentic relationship with our neighbor, with creation, and ultimately reduces our capacity to love and follow God with authenticity.

Jesus calls us to repentance and transformation away from the systems and stuff that hold us all captive. We are invited to partner in God's dream for this world, through downward mobility, solidarity, and actions which point to God's kingdom of justice and peace. We are called to a topsy-turvy way of life!

Of course this is not easy. It is challenging, painful work that requires commitment, community, and prayer. I am consoled by Jesus' words today: "For humans it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." Jesus also promises that discipleship is worth it. I don't think Jesus meant that we'll get more stuff, but perhaps that we'll find a new abundance when our hands are open to receive God's gifts. We will find a renewed capacity for love and gratitude, and we will be knit together into restored relationship with all creation as we follow God's call into the topsy-turvy world of the kingdom.

When we pray "thy kingdom come," let us open our hands and hearts to receive the wisdom to discern God's ways, be filled with God's love, and be transformed to follow as disciples. Let us follow Jesus!

# CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD


