The Power of Persistence

Widows, in Jesus' time, were people on the margins of society. Without a male relative, these women were often destitute and reliant on the support of others. As I encounter the central character in this parable, I imagine the weight of poverty bearing down upon her, and the injustice she is facing that has brought her before a judge who has no concern for anyone but himself. His court is ruled by corruption and bribery, rather than justice and fairness. The court was a space for men, so the widow's presence there as a woman in the public sphere would have been disruptive to the status quo. Somehow, despite all these systems of oppression, she has the energy to keep crying out for justice, and her persistence (even in her powerlessness) wins her justice in her case.

I wonder what gave her the strength day after day to show up for her just cause, despite the overwhelming obstacles? Perhaps, like Moses in today's reading, she had a circle of friends to encourage her when she was weary. Perhaps it was the words of scripture that rang in her ears to train her in righteousness and equip her for her work, so she trusted that the Lord heard her cry and would be at her side.

In my own life, I am grateful for all those who have shared faith with me, and who have strengthened me to be persistent in prayer and action. These mentors and friends have helped me to keep my arms raised in prayer when I was weary and discouraged. They have helped me to keep living the Gospel in the face of obstacles and oppression. I know that I am called to do the same for others, offering them nourishment and support for their faith journey.

Since 1856, St. Basil's Parish has been home to people of all ages and needs. We are blessed because you are here!

Late last week, Pope Leo XIV released an Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexit Te*, on love for the poor. I have just begun reading it, and am moved by the reminder to keep God's love of the poor at the heart of our life and practice of our faith, for this is the good news that Christ came to proclaim. Especially on this World Mission Sunday, let us commit anew to being pilgrims of hope in our prayer and action, together bearing good news in our world, particularly for those most in need of experiencing Christ's liberating mission.


