HAVE HOPE: THE LORD HEARS!

The scriptures today dwell on the themes of prayer, humility and social justice.

The book of Sirach, part of the Bible's Wisdom literature, includes instructions on moral and religious life for the Jewish society of the 2nd century before Christ. Our first reading begins by proclaiming the impartiality of God. I think this means we are all invited to prayer and, in prayer, all stand equal before God.


Indeed, the reading asserts that it is the prayers of the least of us that will be heard and receive a response. God will respond to the prayers of the humble, of widows, orphans and others who plead for justice. The theme is continued in today's psalm, which proclaims: "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit." In that time, widows and orphans were the most vulnerable in society because they lacked the family ties and supports that others had. We might well ask who are the people in similar situations in our own society – the homeless, the single parents with insufficient incomes, the users of food banks et cetera?

We are called to be hopeful and persistent in our prayer. We might not get an immediate response, but neither necessarily will we have to wait. God might surprise us and "not delay".

The theme of hope and persistence in prayer in spite of adversity connects us to the second reading. St Paul is looking back on his life, having completed his mission and having "finished the race". He recalls how at times he had felt defeated and lonely, wondering if God had abandoned him. Yet, with prayer and the help of God, St Paul had persisted and had been "rescued from the lion's mouth". He could finally look back on his life triumphantly, having brought the message of the Gospel to the Gentiles. He was ready to pass on the responsibility to other disciples. From thereon, the torch was passed from generation to generation, and ultimately to us today, to spread the message.

Many of us have felt the despondency that comes with failing to achieve the things we are committed to and believe in. These readings encourage us to persevere and remain hopeful and prayerful.


