FOR GOD SO LOVED...

"God so loved the world..."

This passage from John 3:16 is so familiar from Bible tracts and signboards that its message is obscured. In fact, it concerns the salvation not only of the pricelessly unique person that you are, but also the entire cosmos. Indeed, 'cosmos' is the very word in the original biblical Greek that is translated as 'world'.

Cosmos means the entire universe.

In my work as a field biologist, I am frequently amazed by what is out there, hiding in plain sight – just as our over-familiarity with John chapter 3 obscures its true vastness. One day, I was looking at a small yellowish fly that seemed a bit unfamiliar. A close-up photo with a macro lens revealed that it looked as though it was made of stained glass, or had leapt up from an illuminated manuscript, with filigrees of brown, black, and silver on its wings, a golden body, and emerald green eyes. Creation is extravagant. Revelation tells us it is beloved.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross thus proclaims Christ's redemption creation. In place of Babel, where human power tries to reach heaven by technocratic might, divine wisdom reveals God's descent: "No one ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven" (Jn 3.13).

Our St. Basil's book club recently read A Canticle for Leibowitz: a work of speculative about the interplay between technology, faith, and the forces of hatred and ignorance. Science and technology are not evils - many of the lead characters including the founding saint are scientists. But they threaten creation when they are divorced from the true order of things. In the period that Canticle was written, we were particularly aware of the threat of nuclear war. That threat has not disappeared, but we are now contending with the more insidious problems of climate change caused by CO2 emissions and other alterations of the earth's atmosphere, as well as the degradation of natural habitats and the loss of biodiversity.

Inspired by this Season of Creation (September 1 - October 4), let us as Church carry on with the transcendent hope entrusted to us, and help to preserve our natural and cultural heritage.


