FAITH IN FOCUS

Has loving someone ever changed you? I find pieces of every person I have loved woven into the fabric of my being. My mother's love of dancing, my father's laugh. Phrases and mannerisms picked up from roommates. My taste in music shaped by each mixtape lovingly gifted by my friend. I am "me" because of the love I have experienced. Similarly, I know my beloved ones carry reflections of my personality and passion with them. Ultimately, love changes

So, what does it mean then, that we say we love God? How has our encounter with God formed and transformed us? Our readings this week remind us that our faith requires a response. The Prophet Isaiah and the Psalmist demonstrate the courage, strength, trust, and hope that comes from a lifetime of experiencing God's faithful action. Saint James admonishes us to let our love be manifest in action, particularly tangible works of justice and peace. Words are not enough. Our scriptures all point to this reality: there is a cost and commitment to our Christian life. A deep and loving relationship with God means becoming people who see, judge, and act in ways that are different than the world's vision. We must partner with God's dream for our world.

Jesus asks his disciples in the Gospel: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answers quickly: The Christ (Messiah). Peter knows Jesus is special – it is why Peter left everything to follow. Yet, he does not fully understand. The disciples expected the Messiah to be a powerful warrior. Instead, Jesus proclaims and lives a way of love, service, and encounter which leads to his rejection, suffering, and death. Peter is terrified – he cannot accept the dangerous cost of Jesus' way. Despite the objections, Jesus – God's love made flesh – remains committed to embodying God's vision and invites the disciples to know, love, and follow him anew. We know

that eventually Peter will be fully transformed by his encounter with the Risen Jesus, and will embrace Jesus' Way, even at great cost. After all, love changes us.

"Who do you say that I am?" – Jesus asks us today. How do we answer? Perhaps like Peter, we might think we have an answer, but Jesus invites us even more deeply to know, love, and follow. This Fall, our parish offers numerous opportunities to encounter Jesus through prayer. Join us to listen, learn, and live out this love more in our daily lives.

Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we meet Jesus and can allow our relationship with him to shape the fabric of our lives. Today's "Faith in Focus" offers suggestions for preparing for Mass. At Mass Jesus is truly present, wanting to encounter us and empower us to embody his love in our world. I pray that our celebration will so immerse us in God's love that everyone we meet will catch glimpses of the One who loves us.


