ATTENTIVE TO MY NEIGHBOUR


This week's gospel teaches us about the striking differences between the lives (and deaths) of poor Lazarus and the rich man. As I read, I find myself being challenged by the indifference and blindness that can often accompany privilege. St. Basil the Great, our parish's patron saint, expands on this and is quoted as saying, "The bread in your cupboard belongs to the hungry; [...] the money that you keep locked away is the money of the poor; the acts of charity that you do not perform are so many injustices that you commit." Taken together, these messages help me to remember that our skills and resources are gifts from God meant to benefit the common good, and they call me to live my faith in a practical way that serves our most vulnerable brothers and sisters.

I also can't help but be inspired by the generosity that I see all around me. Especially here at St. Basil's, where every day I am surrounded by examples of charity, compassion, and care in action. Take, for instance, the incredible woman who joins us for our Out of the Cold community outreach lunch, carrying everything she owns with her. She insists on leaving enough for the others who may join us later, so she will never take more than she needs to satisfy her hunger in the moment. Her selflessness truly moves me, and through her generous spirit, I better understand the importance of sharing what we have.


