



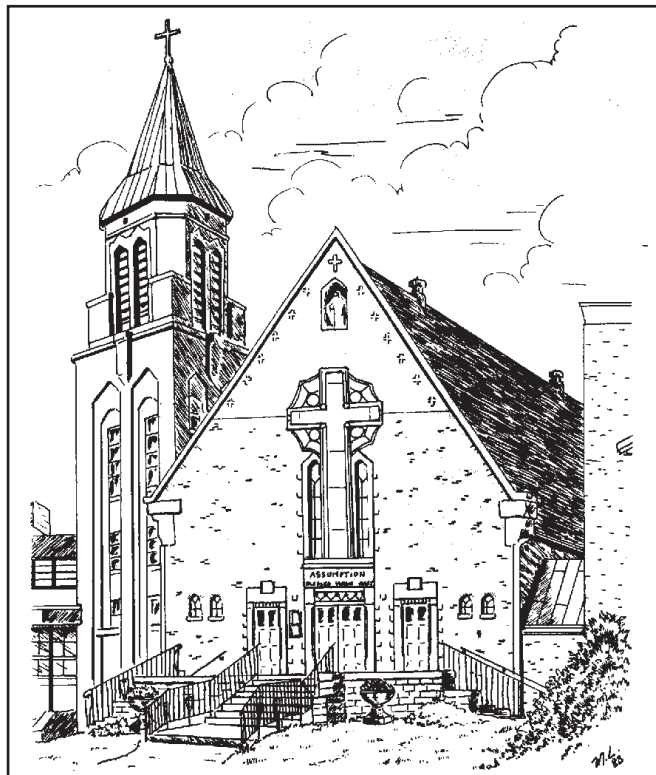

PASTORAL & SACRAMENTAL CARE

Baptism: Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment to register your child for Baptism and to discuss all the requirements. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register and attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

Confessions: Weekdays, after the 8 am morning Mass (approach the priest); First Fridays - 8:45 am to 9:15 am; First Saturdays - 9:30 am to 10:00 am, 3:30 pm to 4:00 pm (by appointment) Every Sunday - 11:30 am to 12noon

Marriages: One of the couples must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

Sacrament of the Sick & Communion for Shut-ins:
Please contact the Parish Office

Funerals: Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial Assisted by the Bereavement Ministry

Youth Ministry: Every 1st Saturday of the month, 30 to 45 min. session (after the 4 pm Mass) at Carlo Acutis Hall.

The **PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE** may be gained each year **from noon (12:00 p.m.) on August 1 through midnight (11:59 p.m.) on August 2**. The faithful may receive the indulgence once by fulfilling the required conditions: (1) Visit a parish church or a Franciscan church or shrine; (2) Pray the Our Father and the Creed; (3) Receive Sacramental Confession within about 20 days before or after; (4) Receive Holy Communion; (5) Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. (6) Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin. ***The indulgence may be applied either to oneself or to a deceased member of the faithful.***

COMMUNITY BREAKFAST EVENTS on the 1st Sunday (**August 2**) and another on **August 16** will also be Fiesta events, since the church hall accommodates not more than 200 people only on August 15 (the actual Parish Fiesta), giving those who usually come together only on Sunday a chance to celebrate, too.

SAVE THE DATE -- PARISH FIESTA CELEBRATION will be on **August 15, 2026** (Saturday). ***The approved activities*** are children's games at 2:30 p.m., MASS at 4:00 PM, followed by a short program and a simple dinner.

To ensure we do not exceed the maximum capacity of Immaculata Hall, the Fiesta Committee 2026 has introduced an entry ticket that can be purchased for a minimal fee of \$5 per interested parishioner.

It is available through select volunteers, and soon the Fiesta committee members will also set up a table in the Church foyer after Sunday Masses.

"SAINT FRANCIS LIVES ON" – Franciscan Jubilee Year (January 10, 2026 – January 10, 2027). Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed a special Franciscan Jubilee Year to commemorate the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis of Assisi's death. The Jubilee invites all Christians to renew their commitment to simplicity, humility, charity, peace, reconciliation, and care for creation, following the example of Saint Francis.

The Apostolic Penitentiary grants a **plenary indulgence** to the faithful who participate devoutly under the usual conditions. Pilgrimages to Franciscan churches or shrines are encouraged, while those unable to travel may unite spiritually through prayer and the offering of their sufferings. More than a commemoration, this Jubilee is a call to live the Gospel through concrete acts of love, fraternity, justice, and care for our common home, showing that the spirit of Saint Francis continues to inspire the Church and the world today.



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
