PASTOR'S DESK

<u>Annual Outdoor Mass</u> will be celebrated this weekend at the Sunday 10:30 a.m. Mass (weather permitting). This annual mass is an opportunity to experience the external feast of our patron St. Augustine. Normally the feast is celebrated on Aug. 28th. It is beautiful time for parishioners to come together and experience in a unique way our common faith and spirit of our patron. This celebratory mass will be followed by "coffee Sunday" and fellowship in parish hall.

<u>Preparation for Sacraments for Adults</u> will commence on Thurs. Sept. 11, at 7 p.m. in the conference room (rectory). Normally this is called the RCIA program; an opportunity to journey together toward the Easter Vigil on Faith and Gospel teaching. Planning for a Funeral If we listen carefully to the texts used at a funeral liturgy, we discover that there are several references made to the baptism of the person who is now deceased. One reference occurs at the very beginning of the liturgy, during the rite of the reception of the body. To emphasize the importance of the person's baptism, the Church in Canada encourages the use of a pall at the funeral liturgy. This pall is to be placed on the coffin during the rite of reception of the body by family members, friends, or by parish ministers. This pall is a reminder of the white baptismal garment, a sign of the Christian dignity of the person. Just as the new Christian was clothed in the white garment when he or she became a member of the Church, the coffin is covered with a white cloth as the person enters into a new life in the resurrection of Jesus.

Eucharist under both species

You've probably noticed by now that we are offering Communion under both species (bread and wine) at the 10:30 a.mm. Sunday Mass. We are grateful for the volunteers who are offering their time and talent. If we were to offer this at all masses, we would certainly need more ministers. (FYI, the Mayo clinic has done studies on communion from the Cup and people have more germs (dipping) in the water fonts than from the cup).
