Living Stewardship

"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers for the harvesting." Matthew 9:37-38 A steward is not a spectator. We are not called to simply cheer on other people as they do good work. All of us are expected to roll up our sleeves and participate in the work of the church.

Sent on Mission: In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

Eucharistic adoration is a time for prayer in which Christians—particularly the Catholic faithful—adore our Lord Jesus Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Adoration can take place either when the Church reserves our Eucharistic Lord Jesus in the tabernacle, or when a priest or deacon exposes the consecrated Host in a monstrance outside of Mass. This type of worship logically flows from the Catholic dogma that Jesus is truly and sacramentally present—body, blood, soul, and divinity—in the Eucharist, in this case under the appearance of bread in the consecrated Host. **Join us every Morning from 7am till mass time at 8:30 am from Monday through Thursday and Saturday morning till June.**

Cremation: The Catholic Church has a long history of teaching that the human body is sacred and should be treated with respect. This teaching is based on the belief that the human body is created in the image and likeness of God, according to Genesis 1:27. Because of this, the Church has typically preferred that the bodies of the faithful have a traditional burial after death. However, the Church also recognizes that there are valid reasons why some people may choose to have their loved ones cremated. The Church also teaches that cremation should not be chosen for reasons that are contrary to the faith. For example, cremation should not be chosen to deny the resurrection of the body, or to express indifference to the human body. If a Catholic chooses to have their loved one cremated, the Church asks that the cremated remains be treated with respect. The remains should not be scattered, divided, or kept in mementos. Instead, they should be buried in a sacred place, such as a church cemetery. ****Additional information can be found in the pamphlet available at the church entrances ****

SCRIPTURE READINGS – JUNE 14th

First Reading: Exodus 19:2-6a: The Israelites arrive at Mount Sinai, where God speaks to Moses and tells him to convey a message to the people. God reminds the Israelites of how He delivered them from slavery in Egypt and declares that if they obey His commands and keep His covenant, they will be a treasured possession and a kingdom of priests.

Second Reading: Romans 5:6-11: God showed His love for humanity by sending Jesus Christ to die for our sins while we were still sinners. Through Jesus' sacrifice, we can be reconciled with God and receive the gift of eternal life

Gospel: Matthew 9:36-10:8: Jesus has compassion for the crowds. He decides to send out His twelve disciples to heal the sick, raise the dead, and proclaim the good news of the kingdom of heaven. Jesus instructs His disciples to freely give what they have received, encouraging them to serve others with love and generosity.
