Stewardship Reflections – Stewards Care

"Pilate again said to them, 'Then what shall I do with the man whom you call the King of the Jews?' And they cried out again, 'Crucify him.'" – MARK 15:12-13

Jesus told us "whatever you do for the least of my brothers, you do for me." Every day we are presented opportunities to help someone. Every day we have the opportunity to see the face of Jesus in others and be the face of Jesus to others. Every day we pass by someone in need. Pray for the strength and courage to live Stewardship by being the answer to someone's prayer.

Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday)

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" The crowds greeted Jesus' entry into Jerusalem with joyful enthusiasm. A few days later some of those people were undoubtedly part of the hate-filled crowd screaming "CRUCIFY HIM!" Peter, who promised Jesus that he would never betray him, does so just hours later. How can something so wonderful take such an ugly turn? How does that happen in our world, lives, and hearts? How can it get so bad so quickly? You will notice the Liturgy today is one of contrasts ... from Hosanna's at the entrance to the dramatic portrayal of the Passion narrative ... and then ideally leave in 'shared silence', respecting the incomplete nature, as we enter Holy Week!

Special moments of Holy Week (Fr. Frank)

I have always appreciated the drama of Holy Week. Palm Sunday is one of a dramatic portrayal with RED vestments, the Passion narrative from Mark's Gospel (year B) and the dismissal in silence. The Chrism Mass at 5:00 p.m., Tuesday evening at the Cathedral with the Blessing of Oils and the renewal of promises priests made at their ordination. Holy Thursday evening's solemn launch into the Triduum and the Paschal mystery with the washing of feet (volunteers) and the solemn procession to the place of repose of the Holy Eucharist. Good Friday is a continuation of Holy Thursday, prostration of priests, the Passion narrative of the Gospel of John and adoration of the Cross. The Easter Vigil on Saturday evening with the blessing of the (new) fire and the lighting of the Paschal candle ... enter the dark church ... all the readings from OT and the NT ... Baptism and Confirmation and the Resurrection party in parish hall and culminates with the Easter Sunday morning's liturgies and all the visitors! Blessed Easter everyone... Christ has Died, Christ has Risen, Christ will come again!

Accessibility is an ongoing challenge in many churches. Having visited Our Lady of Fatima Parish last week for the parish Penance Liturgy, I was struck again at how accessible it is, with "street level" entrance ways and NO stairs. Here at St Augustine church, which was built in 1955, there has been some modification, with the addition of the "outdoor" ramp, the front entrance washroom and the lift for parish hall (10 yrs. ago). However, when you arrive at the church, you have to be dropped off at front door for physically challenged folks! Our parking lot is way in the back. As you read this you are invited to review and comment on the parish survey. You can access the survey on the parish website or by scanning the QR code available in the bulletin announcement or on the posters at Church entrances. Communication and awareness will be key in moving forward. Here are some things to consider:

- Evaluate how fully worship experiences allow everyone to participate.
- Consider alternative phrasing (e.g., "You're invited to rise in body or in spirit" instead of "please stand").
