

SATURDAY MASS TIME CHANGE

The response has been very favorable, therefore beginning on the first weekend of Advent,

Saturday, November 29th, Mass will be celebrated at 5:00 pm



All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. The day is primarily celebrated in the Catholic Church, but it is also celebrated in the Eastern Orthodox Church and a few other denominations of Christianity. Most protestant denominations do not recognize the Feast and disagree with the theology behind it. However, the Anglican church

is the largest protestant church to celebrate this holy day.

According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person goes when they die in the state of perfect grace and communion with God. We celebrate this in the Feast of All Saints. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go to receive purification before seeing the face of God. Remembering that only saints are in heaven.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... thus making atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin." Additional references are found in Zechariah, Sirach, and the Gospel of Matthew. Jewish tradition also reinforces this belief, as well as, the tradition and teaching of the Church, which has been affirmed throughout history.

Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.

The belief in purgatory has not been without controversy, especially arising from the abuse during a period in the church when indulgences were being sold for profit for private and public church coffers. It was one reason that led Martin Luther to the protestant reformation. When Martin Luther translated the Bible into German, he omitted the seven books of the canon which refer to prayers for the dead. He then introduced the belief, condemned by the Church, that people are simply saved, or not, and argued that there is no need to pray for the dead to get them into heaven. The Church reeled from Luther's accusation and reformed its practice of selling indulgences. However, it reemphasized the Biblical and traditional practice of praying for the departed and the importance of such prayers.

INDULGENCE for Feast of All Souls.

INDULGENCE

Remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. It may be applied to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

PARTIAL AND PLENARY INDULGENCE

A Partial Indulgence partially frees a person from the temporal punishment, while a Plenary Indulgence completely frees them from all temporal punishment. A plenary indulgence is a more complete remission and is typically harder to gain, while Partial indulgences are granted for many daily pious acts, and there is no limit to the number that can be received per day. The following are two special indulgences for All Souls.

Visiting a Cemetery: Plenary Indulgence to those who visit a cemetery and pray, <u>even if only mentally</u>, for the departed from November 1-8; on other days of the year, it is only a partial indulgence.

Visiting a Church on November 2: A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, piously visit a church and recite the Our Father and the Creed. It is also acceptable to visit the church on the Sunday before or after All Souls.

To acquire a plenary indulgence, it is necessary also to receive Confession, Eucharist and pray for the Intentions of the Pope all completed in a reasonable period of time, within a month of the pious act. Prayers for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary.

V. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. R. And let the perpetual light shine upon them.

May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.



POT LUCK CHRISTMAS PARTY Sunday, December 14th


