

Today's Gospel sounds puzzling to contemporary readers, but it can be made less so by considering the economic system which stands behind the parable. The story is either called the Parable of the Dishonest Steward or Prudent Manager, depending on which way we read it.

A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property. He is called dishonest because he is not serving the interests of the rich man, his employer.

In response the steward, in an attempt to ensure favor for himself among the rich man's debtors, brokers repayment of the rich man's loans by foregoing the interest and fees that had been levied to line the steward's pockets. It is this action, in which the steward puts aside his greed and takes the longer perspective in order to enhance his security, which is commended by the rich man.

However, if we read the steward as a prudent manager, the passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Like the steward in the parable, those who would follow Jesus must put transitory affairs in proper perspective. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward eternal life.

The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God. Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two master's simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money.

ST. PIO OF PIETRELCINA, more commonly known as "Padre Pio," is one of the most extraordinary and fascinating saints of modern times. Many miracles, even while he was living, have been attributed to his intercession; he had the ability bi-locate (being at two places at the same time); he was witnessed by many to have levitated while celebrating Mass; and he bore the stigmata of Christ, to the point of having to bandage his hands. Born in 1887, he eventually became a Franciscan priest and died in 1968. He shared a friendship with Pope John Paul who beatified and canonized Padre Pio, recognizing him as a saint, in 2002.

ST. COSMOS AND DAMIAN were twins born to Christian parents in Arabia, in the 3rd century; and they embraced Christianity and practised medicine without charging a fee. Their selfless dedication to healing, combined with their generosity and compassion, made them beloved figures in their community. In art, they are often depicted holding medical instruments or ointment jars, as a testament to their role as healers. In 287, they were captured and ordered to deny their faith in Christ. They refused and underwent a series of tortures, including crucifixion, from which, miraculously, they remained unscathed. The torturers, weary of what they realized was the impossible task of forcing apostasy from their mouths, finally beheaded them both.

STS. JOHN DE BREBEUF, ISAAC JOGUES AND **COMPANIONS.** This feast honours the eight martyrs of North America: six Jesuit priests and two lay assistants who died between 1642 and 1649. They all came from Europe as missionaries to preach the Gospel. These men were aware of the dangers involved and of the fate of captives but persisted in their efforts. The shrine in Midland was erected in their memory, and they are the secondary Patrons of Canada.

Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

On Thursdays following the 12 noon Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and the church will remain open for private prayer until 2pm. when Benediction will be celebrated.
