From the Pastor's desk

Bells

Many people have mentioned to me that they are happy to hear the bells in our belfry. The one bell which was in the original St. Anthony Church was returned to the parish by Dennis Smerchanski. His father purchased and donated that bell. When the new church was built they returned the original bell to the Smerchanski family. The other bell came to us from the Sisters of the Good Shepherd before they left Marymount. Usually when bells are cast for a certain location, they harmonize. Our bells were made for two different locations; thus their harmony is not tuned. The bells ring the Angelus daily at 12 noon and 6 pm. They also ring prior to the Saturday, 4 pm Mass and the Sunday 11 am Mass. A big **Thank You** to those who contributed to the bell fund. the bells are one of the memorials of our 100th Anniversary during the Jubilee Year.

Freemasons

Every so often I repeat the fact that the Freemasons are irreconcilable with the Catholic faith. The Freemasons are the largest worldwide oath-bound secret society. Freemasonry promotes ideas and rituals incompatible with the Catholic faith, including indifferentism, or the position that a person can be equally pleasing to God while remaining in any religion and a deistic concept of a "Great Architect of the Universe." Since the year 1738, the Popes have warned of the intrinsic deceitfulness of Freemasonry because it rejects Jesus Christ as the Saviour and Redeemer. The Vatican released a document on [15 Nov. 2023](#) once again reaffirming that **Catholics are forbidden from becoming Freemasons.**
