From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

Christ is risen! Truly he is risen! Alleluia!

Easter has long been one of my favorite celebrations in the Church year. Even when I was in grade school, I was always transfixed by the Liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and especially the Easter Vigil. I vividly remember that when we learned about the Easter Vigil in third grade, I begged my parents to take me, so that I could experience it for myself. perhaps that was a portent for things to come!

Two years ago, I had the privilege of making a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. On that pilgrimage, my love for the Easter celebrations was kindled anew, as I walked where Jesus walked, and saw the very places where the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord took place. Making that pilgrimage did one very important thing for me: It reminded me in a very powerful way that the events we celebrate this weekend are real- that in this place, at a specific time in history, Jesus Christ, the Son of God, became man, suffered and died on the cross, and rose from the dead to save us all from our sins.

There is a certain beauty in the way we celebrate Easter. For me, one of the most powerful moments is at the vigil, when the newly lit Easter Candle is brought into the church, which is in total darkness. In that moment, light overcomes darkness, and as the church listens to the words of the Easter Proclamation, we are reminded that Christ has won the ultimate victory over sin and death. This is a beauty that I hope to discover anew, especially as I celebrate the Easter mysteries for the first time as a Priest!

The Resurrection of Christ from the dead truly was a ground-breaking and earth-shattering event. Nothing like it had ever happened before, and nothing like it has ever happened since. And the effects of that event continue to be felt today, more than 2000 years after Christ rose from the dead! Throughout the Easter Season, we will look at why this is, as we begin a new Sermon Series titled "Groundbreaking." In this series, we will also talk more about some groundbreaking things going on right here at Assumption!

On behalf of myself, Fr. Maurice, Deacon Paul, and the entire staff of Assumption Parish, I wish you a Happy and Blessed Easter! May the peace and the joy of the Risen Lord be yours during this holy season.


