Pastoral Plan Revisited

For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of one aspect of the Pastoral Priority Plan that was presented at masses on June $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$. This will help explain it, and keep it in the forefront of our minds.

Pastoral Priority 3: "Create a parish of inclusion"

During the pastoral plan discernment, pastoral council members discussed many of the strengths of our parish as well as areas to improve. Strengths included our rich cultural diversity, the presence of post secondary students, the building of one community from four separate parishes, our service to those in need, our meaningful liturgies, and more. Included in those reflections were other observations that developed into our 3rd pastoral priority, "Create a parish of inclusion". What is meant by this term? Pastoral council believes that there are some concrete things we can do with these strengths that are listed here, to become a more authentically inclusive community. Our large geographical area tells us that we have many more parishioners than we may know, or have in our parish data base. It's important for us to know who the people of Assumption Parish are, in order to minister to their needs effectively. The council would like to see a parish census to enable us to connect with those we do not know at this time, reaching out into the parish and local community. Also, we welcome those who live with us while engaged in their studies, and would like to offer opportunity for these new neighbours and parishioners to integrate into our parish life and ministry. It is our hope that one day all of our parish groups will reflect the beautiful diversity of culture, ages, and life experience we have in our assembly, and in our community. That is why the council would like to be intentional about reaching out to newcomers in the area, the newly married and the families we meet at baptism, as well. Assumption Parish projects an image of the universal church, united as the body of Christ, sharing God's love with all God's people. On the journey of intentional discipleship, as we reach out to our families and community, we will be growing as a parish of inclusion, and living out our vision as a "beacon of mercy, service and discipleship" in Windsor's West End.

"Hospitality" here at Assumption Parish is a commonly used term to describe a vitally important element of hospitality ministry - those who serve our **food and fellowship** events. These ministers of hospitality prepare and serve refreshments at many parish functions: coffee Sundays, our ice cream socials, special celebrations of meeting or saying good-bye to staff, and assorted other parish events where refreshments or even meals are important pieces of the event. They do a lot of work with the intent to provide an atmosphere for building community, socializing, and sharing our faith. In youth ministry circles it is often said that any attractive youth ministry event will be loaded with food, friends, faith and fun! That is what the food and fellowship ministry provides. They provide the environment which enables us to spend time in conversation after celebrating mass together, or at a special event. This is a great ministry for those who enjoy preparing and serving food and refreshment, encouraging conversation, and feeding the body and soul at the same time! This may be an ideal way for you to share of your gifts and talents with our community and a fine way to encourage others on the journey of intentional discipleship with you. It's a wonderful way to enter into the community and meet your fellow parishioners. Always, more are welcome in the ministry, and more are needed. Perhaps you could ask God if the ministry of food and fel**lowship** is the one through which you are called to contribute to our parish hospitality ministries. During September there will be an opportunity to indicate how you might like to be involved. In the meantime let's all say a special prayer of Thanksgiving, and offer our heartfelt thanks to those already so dedicated to the food and fellowship aspect of our parish hospitality. You serve us so well! Thank you!
