

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Joshua 24:1-18; Ps. 33; Ephesians 5:21-32; John 6:60-69

As we continue in these weeks to focus on the gift of the Eucharist, consider the congregation at liturgy on a given Sunday in a parish church. Here is a woman who comes early and enters by the side door that offers a ramp for her invalid husband's wheelchair. There is the father of four whose wife was recently diagnosed with cancer. The couple in back is mourning the death of their newborn, and the mother on the aisle is weeping for her son who was arrested in a drug raid....It is well to remember that while we attend the liturgy to praise God, we are there also to support one another by our prayers, our presence, and our care. Together we are the Body of Christ, a suffering body that can rise to the challenges of life through the ministry of its members. We are Eucharist!
