

Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide Time to Stand Up and Speak Out! On June 15, a British Columbia Supreme Court judge declared Canada's laws against physician-assisted suicide unconstitutional because they discriminate against the physically disabled.

The ruling will, if it stands up to an appeal, put Canada in the company of the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg and Switzerland as countries which permit physician-assisted suicide. In addressing the potential risks, the judge wrote "The evidence shows that risks exist. But that they can be very largely avoided through carefully designed, well-monitored safeguards."

Contrary to what promoters of euthanasia and assisted suicide might say, safeguards put in place in countries that have legalized these practices are sooner or later ignored. A study published in the Canadian Medical Association Journal (May 2010) indicates that 32% of all euthanasia deaths in Flanders (Belgium), between June and November 2007, were done without request or consent. **Who is most threatened?**

Those who are sick, aged, those with disabilities and those who are suffering from depression. We must defend the most vulnerable, remembering that we too will someday become vulnerable. We must protect our right to life rather than create a so-called right to die. The solution is not euthanasia or assisted suicide. The solution is palliative care until natural death. We must all have access to palliative care when the time comes. It is a question of public safety, dignity, true compassion and solidarity.
