From the Administrator's Desk...

Merry Christmas! Buon Natale! Joyeux Noël!

On behalf of the Clergy and Staff of the Windsor Heritage Catholic Family of Parishes, I want to extend to you all best wishes and blessings as we celebrate the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

The Christmas season is a season of light. We see lights all over the place: decorating homes, in shopping centres, and even in our Churches. All of these lights remind us of Christ, who is the light of the world, and who shines in the midst of the darkness. We have been reflecting on the coming of this light throughout the Advent season, as we lit the candles of the Advent wreath. And now, we hear the Christmas Readings speak eloquently to us of this light. Isaiah tells us that "The people who have walked in darkness have seen a great light." This light is the child who is called "Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace." St. John tells us that this light "shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

To me, this theme of light seems even more important this year, as we look at everything that is happening in our world. It seems that lately when we turn on the news, All we see is darkness. This darkness can make it hard to focus on the light. And yet, that is exactly what our faith calls us to do. Our faith asks us to focus on Christ, the Light of the World, and trust in his promise that in the fullness of time, we will see the fullness of the fruits of his victory over sin and death.

Christmas also reminds us of the importance of doing our part to reflect Christ's light, by working towards the vision of Peace on Earth expressed by the angels as they announced Christ's birth to the shepherds. The poet Howard Thurman gives us a beautiful reminder of how to live in this spirit, and reflect the Light of Christ. He Writes: "When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and the princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flocks, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among people, To make music in the heart."

May the Peace and the Spirit of Christmas be with each of you during this season, and may this peace reign in your hearts in the new year to come.

LAST DATE FOR 2023 DONATIONS

The last day to drop off 2023 donations to the parish office is Friday, December 22nd by noon. The last day you can donate for the 2023 income tax receipt at Sunday Mass, by mail and online is Sunday, December 31st. **PLEASE NOTE:** The date of donation is the date the gift is actually received by the charity. When a charity receives a donation by mail, the Canada Revenue Agency considers the date of donation to be the date of the postmark on the envelope. An example of this is when a parishioner mails a donation in December to the Parish, but the Parish does not receive the donation until January with a January postmark. The donation would be posted to January, not December. This also applies to December donations dropped off to the office in January.
