From The Pastors Desk...

Happy New Year! Lots of my spiritual reading over recently has focused on gratitude. Studies have even shown how being grateful has a positive effect on one's physical and emotional health. As we end the year 2017 it is easy for me to look back with gratitude for all of you here at Assumption. During this year of festivities celebrating 250 years of our parish's existence, I can be nothing but thankful. The four celebrations highlighting St. Patrick, Blessed Sacrament, Assumption, and Holy Name of Mary were beautiful celebrations of memory and of unity. And then on October 1, our Sestercentennial Mass and Gala luncheon were moments of special grace, acknowledging the past and looking towards our future. Then recently Fr. John Thomas Lane preached an Advent Mission, and we celebrated 25 years honouring Our Lady of Guadalupe. So many of you worked long hours to make each celebration a joyful moment of grace, and I am grateful.

This weekend the Church celebrates two special feasts: The Holy Family, and Mary, Mother of God. On Sunday we focus on the human family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We are reminded that they-as individuals and as a family-were obedient to God's law. That helps keep me on track those many times when I am tempted to think that I am above the law, that the rules and regulations don't apply to me. If even Jesus in his humanity was subject to the law, then who am I to think that I somehow am so special that I can decide what is best for me? And 2018 begins, as does every calendar year, with a focus on Mary as the Mother of God. This is a title conferred upon Our Lady at the Council of Ephesus in 431, which really speaks more about Jesus than it does about his mother. Jesus' humanity and divinity are so intertwined that they cannot be separated from one another. Mary did not give birth only to Jesus' human nature, but to Jesus in his entirety, God and human. Thus we have such deeply profound yet seemingly contradictory pronouncements that Mary gave birth to her Creator! For me, this feast is a reminder that God is inextricably a part of my own human experience. That makes me all the more grateful.

As we begin this new calendar year, I pray that the newborn Christ fill each of you with his blessings and grace.
