SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

February 19th, 2012

Readings: Isaiah 43:18-25; 2 Cor. 1:18-22; Mk. 2:1-12



Do we realize that our faith can bring others to a healing encounter with Christ? The paralytic in today's gospel is dependent on his friends for contact with Christ, and their determination is such that they remove the roof of the house in which Jesus is engaged in preaching. Jesus is moved by their faith. First he forgives the man's sins, claiming for himself God's unique authority; only then does he restore the sick man to health. Mark presents Jesus as much more

than a wonderworker; he acts with God's authority, and must be accepted or rejected on that basis. In the first reading, God declares that he alone forgives and forgets sin, creating a new people of praise despite their rebellion or disinterest. Paul defends the work of himself and his co-workers by reminding the Corinthians how faithful Jesus was to God's will; this fidelity is imitated by his apostles. Through Jesus, and imitating the *yes* of the apostles, Christians can say *yes* to God, living their *Amen* to the great thanksgiving prayer of Christ in the Mass.

From the Pastor's Desk

I could not help but note that Mark's gospel for this weekend is certainly helpful in focusing our attention on the Season of Lent which begins this Wednesday as Jesus proclaims to us that he, indeed, has the divine power to forgive sins that, in fact, he is the forgiveness of sin. This is a privileged time for our parish and all are encouraged to the traditional observances of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These 40 days are a moment of grace and reconciliation for each and every one of us and the parish as a whole. I am very aware that this is a time of transition for us and this last year has proven a particular challenge for some. Somehow we expect our church to be a place of rootedness and security, immune from the world of rapid change around us. But we are certainly as vulnerable to change as every other institution these days-with one exception. Our faith, our lives, our parish are all centred on the Lord Jesus who assures us of his presence, his grace, his support in the midst of both stormy and calm seas. Of this we can be absolutely certain and as we now begin the journey to Jerusalem, let us remember that he has gone this path once before and will lead us through the passion to resurrection. On Wednesday, the journey begins.....
