#### FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

February 26th, 2012



Readings: Genesis 9:8-15; 1 Peter 3:18-22; Mark 1:12-15

Does anyone really look forward to Lent? What is it about Lent that excites us? What aspects of the Lenten journey test us? The Scriptural readings for this season are carefully chosen so as to replay salvation history before our very eyes. This Sunday, we find Jesus in the desert. The desert sun and the pangs of hunger and thirst

conjured up the demon for him. Mark presents Jesus wrestling with the power of Satan, alone and silent in the desert wastes. Mark's version of the temptations of Jesus does not mention three temptations, nor does it say that Jesus fasted. Mark's whole focus is on presenting the temptations of Jesus as part of the great struggle between good and evil, between God and Satan. This desert experience of Jesus raises important questions for us. What are some of the "desert" experiences I have experienced in my life? What desert experience am I living through right now? When and how do I find moments of prayer in the midst of a busy life? How have I lived in the midst of my own deserts? Have I been courageous and persistent in fighting with my own demons? How have I resisted transforming my own deserts into places of abundant life? We must meet God in the midst of our deserts of sinfulness, selfishness, jealousy, efficiency, isolation, cynicism and despair. And in the midst of the desert we hear what God will do if we open our hearts to him and allow him to make our own deserts bloom. The ways of the desert were deep within the heart of Jesus, and it must be the same for all who would follow him. —*Fr. Thomas Rosica, CSB* 

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners of Assumption Parish,

There are two very important pastoral items that I would like to share with you as we begin this Season of Lent. I am fully conscious of how each of these issues will directly affect our parish in the months ahead and did consider delaying one of them until March. However, upon reflection and counsel, I have decided to announce them both on this weekend.

The first involves Assumption, Holy Name of Mary and Blessed Sacrament: with the closing of Blessed Sacrament on July 1st, it seems now the time to put forward a pastoral plan to bring our worshipping communities under one roof. Therefore, as of July 9/10, both the worshipping communities of Holy Name of Mary and Blessed Sacrament will be invited to join Assumption as one community. Thus our Mass schedule here at Assumption will change to welcome the Holy Name of Mary Community and will be: Sat. vigil at 5 pm; Sunday Mass at 9 am, 11 am and 7:30 pm. Again, the new schedule will take effect on the weekend of July 9/10. Holy Name of Mary building will remain open for a time to continue the Thursday 8:30 am Mass and for weddings/ funerals. We also need the basement for the next while as a meeting space to accommodate the community groups now using the building. It seems that we can finally address the uncertainty of the future of the worshipping community at Holy Name and begin to move forward as this has always been the intention from the beginning. This plan has been discussed at several Pastoral Council meetings and consensus was reached at our meeting on Feb. 14. I discussed this plan with Bishop Fabbro and it has his support.

The second item involves an update on the Campaign. I have enclosed a letter in this bulletin to address this.
